HON. JOSHUA EMILIO S. GELI:

Thank you Mr. Chairman.

I have another Urgent request from the City Mayor pass A Resolution Commending Cadet First Class Jeneth Becera Elumba of Barangay Togbongon, Surigao City, Magna Cum Laude and Class Valedictorian of the Philippine Military Academy (PMA) Bagong Sinag Class of 2024 and authorizing the City Mayor to grant Cash Incentive for the rare honor and prestige given to the Surigaonons. Mr. Chairman, can I read the Resolution prepared for this, Mr. Chairman?

Same as what we did in the Honorarium of our National Line Agencies, only a resolution was passed however there is already an appropriation incorporated in our Annual Budget.

HON, JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Is there an ordinance governing donation to be granted by the City Mayor?

MR. JEFFREY P. GALIDO/ CITY BUDGET OFFICER:

There is no ordinance, but it is incorporated in the Annual Appropriation in our budget, the account title is donations. Which this could be taken if there would be . . .

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Yes, there is a budget for donations. But as to what matters will fall under donations and for which funds can be used. What rules will govern?

MR. JEFFREY P. GALIDO/ CITY BUDGET OFFICER:

It would be the rules of Accounting, of the COA rules and regulations.

HON, JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Accounting and COA regulations? What would be the items that would fall under the donations item in the annual budget?

MR. JEFFREY P. GALIDO/ CITY BUDGET OFFICER:

I cannot memorize the all transactions but this would be the basis if that would be granted. The account title of donations would be used, and it is included same also with other donations that we made of which the amount will be taken or will be deducted.

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

What are the usual items covered by donations?

MR. JEFFREY P. GALIDO/ CITY BUDGET OFFICER:

These are usually the medical donations, we have transportation, we have indigent clients of Surigao City, and we also have education sometimes in education and burial donations.

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HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

That is why this matter is entirely different from those just enumerated by you. That is why we are just curious if we would not be violating any rule or COA rules if we will pass this resolution? Because normally a disbursement of a financial disbursement by the Local Government Unit should be covered by an ordinance.

MR. JEFFREY P. GALIDO/ CITY BUDGET OFFICER:

Yes, I agree with that Sir. But as to the passing of that resolution that would be the discretion of this august body. But if you will be asking me if where would I take t hat? Then we have an Annual Budget for that and it would be taken also from Other MOE perhaps.

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

That is why, do you think an ordinance is needed for the disbursement?
