Transportation, Communication & Utilities conducted The Committee on a public hearing on March 19, 2024, to address the letter from Hayanggabon Transport Service Cooperative or HATSCO, asking the Sanggunian Panlungsod for a Resolution of No Objection to operate taxi services within the city and from the city to other parts of Caraga. The Committee hearing was attended by the HATSCO officers. LTFRB representatives, and representatives from hotels and restaurants establishments.

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During the discussion, HATSCO introduced itself as a registered cooperative, PHIDA Hayanggabon Transport Service Cooperative. Presently, they have two franchises, the UV Express and the Mini-bus services traveling from Surigao City to Claver and Hayanggabon, totaling 25 With their to provide convenient service to Surigaonon and all guests in Surigao, the transport group applied for a franchise to operate taxi services.

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Among the prerequisites outlined by LTFRB for HATSCO's application is the requirement for a Resolution of No Objection from the Sangguniang Panlungsod. LTFRB explained the necessity of such resolution and clarified that LTFRB holds authority in determining operational conditions and obligations, including the number of units and designated routes.

Representatives from hotels and restaurants also expressed their support for taxi operations in Surigao City during the hearing, emphasizing their commitment to providing guests with a more comfortable, seamless, and satisfactory experience.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR.:

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Thank you, Mr. Chairman. This is an urgent request by the Honorable City Mayor, Pablo Yves L. Dumlao, II for an authority to apply for a revocable permit application with the DENR, which is a preliminary step towards acquiring the said facility, which is being planned as a site for the Proposed Regional Fish Port Project, to be funded by the Fisheries Development Authority under the Department of Agriculture. May I ask for the suspension of the rules, Mr. Chairman? So, we can invite Engineer Jo Al Casurra for further presentation.

RULES ARE SUSPENDED.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENRO OFFICER:

So, good afternoon. Good afternoon to the members of this Council. So, the City ENRO will be in charge of the application for the revocable permit application in relation to the Proposed Fish Pond, Fish Port Complex, to be funded by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority, or PFDA, of the Department of Agriculture. Next, please. So, for a background, as mentioned, the Local Government of Surigao City has received a proposal from the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority for the development of a fish port fronting the existing Fish landing to utilize and utilize the ice plant of the PFDA after rehabilitation.

To ensure that the LGUs proper authority to develop the said area covering the foreshore areas, including the PACEMCO port site and the municipal waters at the tenurial instrument must be secured, such as the Foreshore Lease and Miscellaneous Lease Agreement.

So, for a background, what is a Revocable Permit Application? It is a permit issued for a temporary occupation of the said tract of land not covered by a regular public land application. So, kani siya na lupa nga atong gi-applyan naa, it will be disposed by the DENR, which we will be applying to. So, ang atong PACEMCO Port Site is already under a foreshore Lease Agreement, and the Municipal Waters fronting the existing fish landing is for the miscellaneous lease agreement. So, the revocable permit, next please. The revocable permit application is only valid for one year, renewable for another year. So, two years lang ni sya na application while it is a precursor permit prior to the foreshore lease or miscellaneous lease agreement. So, before we um, to have authority over the area, ma-secure ra nato ang authority sa area murag authority to enter the property. So, we will, we have decided to apply for a RPA prior to the tedious foreshore or miscellaneous lease agreement because the miscellaneous lease agreement requires publication and other um, uh, tedious documents to be processed because it is a 25 years tenurial instrument, renewable for another 25 years so 50 years in a total gyud siya. So, mao na sya na, the revocable permit was sought for the said area.

So, um, for reference, we have three lots. Lot No. 1, which is, which is already covered and expired FLA, covering 4,245sg.m. Its current use is the jeepney or bao-bao terminal at the port site. Lot No. 2, FLA Lot No. 2. Um, this covers an area of 8,627sq.m, and it is currently the Wharf of the PACEMCO Port Site. And Lot No. 3, which is a new application, uh, with an area of 49,593 which is currently the temporary boat Anchorage fronting the Fish Landing. So, for reference, mao ni siya ang atong, Government complex, then, sa kilid ang atong PACEMCO port sites. Next, please. So, Lot No. 1 mao ni sya sa Interior. Then, Lot No. 2, the area with the wharf and Lot No. 3, which is the 49,000sq.m. so, mao ni sya ang area for the Proposed Fish Port Complex by PFDA. So, the basic requirements for a revocable permit is for the application form, SP Resolution giving authority of the LCE to apply for a permit, Barangay Certification, sketch plan, and the payment of users fee. These requirements are the basic, no, compared to the tedious and voluminous permit requirements for FLA and MLA. So, for the proposal of the PFDA to be approved here in the City, we will be applying first, for the revocable permit for two years. We will be working within the two years, we will be working for the documents to apply for a 25 years, which is the Foreshore Lease Agreement and for the miscellaneous lease agreement. So that's for the background. Uh, Mr. Chair for the applicant, the proposal or the endorsement of the City ENRO to the City Mayor for the authority to apply for a revocable permit application.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the City Mayor, denominated as URGENT, requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing the him to apply for a Revocable Permit Application (RPA) with the DENR, which is a preliminary step towards acquiring the said facility which is being planned as site of the Proposed Regional Fish Port Project, to be funded by the Fisheries Development Authority (FDA), under the Department of Agriculture;

WHEREAS, the proposed projects will cover three (3) foreshore areas where the necessary permits from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) must be applied to have proper authority to develop the area;

WHEREAS, a Revocable Permit Application (RPA) from the DENR is used for the temporary occupation and use of a tract of land not covered by a regular public land application, valid for one (1) year and renewable for another one (1) year, while preparing for the application of a Miscellaneous Lease Agreement (MLA) with a validity of 25 years and renewable for another 25 years;

WHEREAS, the lots identified for the revocable permit applications are the following:

WHEREAS, after thorough discussion, the August Body finds the request of the City Mayor to be in order and necessary for obtaining the required permits for the Proposed Regional Fish Port Project;

Yes, before I make any motions Mr. Chairman, just like to enumerate the following changes. In the original proposal, the budget for the individual City Councilors, the first ten (10), would now be in the amount of Four Hundred Thousand Pesos (₱400,000.00), then for the ABC and the SK,

additional allocation would be in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (₱200,000.00). Then, as requested by the Secretary of the SP, Other Supplies and Materials Expense, there is an additional allocation of One Hundred Thousand Pesos (₱100,000.00). Then, an additional allocation of One Hundred Thousand Pesos (₱100,000.00) to the contribution to the Philippine Councilors' League.

I think those are the only changes, Mr. Chairman, and principally, the Supplemental Budget No. 1 covers savings from several positions, unfilled or abolished, then transferred to newlycreated plantilla positions. Also, a great portion of it are part of a continuing allocations under the 20% Development Fund, and just being realigned to other projects, Mr. Chairman.

May I move that the proposed Appropriation Ordinance that would cover Supplemental Budget No. 1 for CY 2024 be taken up on 2nd Reading, Mr. Chairman.

The motion to take up take up the matter on second reading was approved. Thereafter, a motion to approve the same on second reading presented and favorably seconded and approved.

So anyway, with regards to this ordinance, I would like to ask our resource person, Ma'am Catherine Olvis, with regards to the background of this ordinance. Anyone from the floor, unsay...what is the general background of this ordinance, why is it needed by the city.

So, basically, we wanted to pass this Ordinance, Establishing the Emergency Medical Response Center of Surigao City. So, last March 2024, we conducted the first reading on this ordinance and we have also invited several resource persons from 911. So basically, we just wanted to have...yes, yes, from Manila national office. And then, basically, we passed this ordinance in order to consolidate the response team of the Local Government of Surigao. So, that's basically the purpose, because we have different response team for health, we also have different response team for CDRRMO. So, we just want to consolidate such that all emergency cases shall be directed only to one command center, and only to one designated response number, and that is, for this ordinance, it is 911. And this is also in consonance with Executive No. 56, Series of 2008 of President Duterte. So, I think that would be enough.

During the discussion, the august body was informed that the proposed Ordinance will create a command center under the CDRRMO which will receive all emergency calls from every Surigaonons. However, 911 hotline is still to be arranged with a provider in order to localize its coverage because for the time being, when the said number is dialed, the call will be directed to 911 National Office in Manila. A software, computer and other equipment will be procured which means it would entail a greater amount in the capital outlay on the first year of its implementation then, on the following years the costs will be based on the subscription of users. Nevertheless, the resource persons cannot provide a rough estimate of the total cost as the 911 National Office is yet to provide them one. It was agreed to suspend the discussion on the matter with a directive to the resource persons to make quantification as to the amount that is involved.
