And we might be asking why is there a need for them to be salary grade 22, where the same law also provides for the same, that with component cities, the DAO IV must have a salary grade of 22, Mr. Chairman. "Upon publication of the position, the concerned Governor, City or Municipal Mayor shall instruct the Local Government Operations Officers, the local Social Welfare and Development Officer, and the President of the local Federation/Association of Persons with Disabilities to prepare for a general assembly of persons with disabilities which shall be conducted on the last day of the posting period. The general assembly shall nominate at least three (3) qualified applicants for consideration of the local selection board and the local Chief Executive. The Human Resource Management Officer shall document the proceedings of the general assembly."

I am confused as to the organization of persons with disabilities...what organization are we talking about?

669	WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9262 is known as The Anti-Violence against Women and their
670	Children Act of 2004 was made into law to recognize "the need to protect the family and its members
671	particularly women and children from violence and threats to their personal safety and security";

673	WHEREAS, Section 12 D, Rule IV of the Rules and Regulations implementing Republic Act
674	9710 of the Magna Carta for Women provides for the establishment of a VAW desk in every barangay
675	to ensure that violence against women cases are fully addressed in a gender-responsive manner;

677	WHEREAS, relative thereto, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG),
678	Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of Education (DepEd),

876	SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE. Any or all ordinances, rules and regulations which

880	SECTION 12. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason any part of this ordinance shall
