Thank you. This committee report was referred to us, denominated as Urgent, with two (2)

indorsement from the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing the City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumalo II to enter into a Service Contract Agreement (SCA) between the

LGU-Surigao City and Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) – Caraga

Region, for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVSC) Program of

the LTFRB.

And with this, the Committee on Transportation, Communication and Utilities acted on the request of the City Mayor, and the Local Government Unit of Surigao is identified by the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board — Caraga Region as one of its Co-Implementors of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVS) Program of the LTFRB, where the initiative of this program is to provide cash subsidies through payouts for contracting public transport services to affected public utility vehicle drivers while ensuring the efficiency and safety of public transport services and "facilitate the broad engagement of public transport cooperatives, associations, or corporations operating in the jurisdiction of the identified Local Government Unit." This is a form of program subsidizing the transportation operations of the qualified operator by the LTFRB to encourage high service standards and enhance the overall commuting experience of the public.

Our Local Government Unit of Surigao has been chosen to be part of this program for the second time. On November 30, 2023, we issued SP Resolution No. 270, Series of 2023, which authorized the City Mayor to enter into a Service Contract Agreement with LTFRB for 2023. This time, the request is for participation for the year 2024, under the General Appropriation Act of 2023.

 Recommendations: our committee has reviewed the proposed Service Contract Agreement for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting Program of the LTFRB, and we find it advantageous and beneficial to our public transport and qualified operators, as well as, to the commuters. We recommend the passing of a resolution authorizing the City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumlao II to enter into the Service Contract Agreement between the Local Government Unit of Surigao and the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) – Caraga Region, for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting Program of the LTFRB.

No. 11936, otherwise known as the General Appropriations Act of 2023 (GAA 2023), the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVSC) Program shall be implemented in partnership with identified and qualified Local Government Units (LGUs) to facilitate the broad engagement of public transport cooperatives, associations, or corporations operating within their jurisdiction;

**WHEREAS,** the LTFRB is mandated under R.A. No. 11936, or the GAA 2023, to be the principal implementing Agency of the program;

**WHEREAS,** the LTFRB shall provide a Service Plan for onboarded PUV operators, monitor the submission of PUVSC reports, coordinate with the LGU for proper implementation of the program, ensure payment to PUV operators based on the Payment Scheme in accordance with labor

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laws and other prevailing laws, and conduct activities necessary for the proper implementation of the program;

**WHEREAS,** the LGU shall designate a focal person, coordinate with the LTFRB, provide certification of temporary rerouting plans or modified route structures, submit necessary reports, assist in the resolution of issues, participate in stakeholders' consultations, and perform other functions necessary for the proper administration and efficient operations of the program;

WHEREAS, the OPERATOR shall undergo orientation, provide necessary information to the LTFRB, ensure payment of salaries and wages to respective drivers and other personnel, comply with the conditions of the program, ensure that all drivers hold valid Professional Driver's Licenses, ensure onboarded units are in good condition, ensure availability of 100% of unit trips, comply with existing LTFRB policies, and submit the Certificate of Payment of Regular Payout;

**WHEREAS,** the GPS PROVIDER shall provide certification of operational GPS devices, provide monitoring access to the LTFRB and LGU, monitor authorized units, submit GPS Trip Report Certifications, and ensure availability of log reports and other data;

**WHEREAS,** regular payouts shall be computed on a weekly basis and processed by the LTFRB upon submission of the GPS Trip Report Certification, with the regular payout being computed based on the number of trips per week and the rate per trip;

DESIGNATED NUMBER. The number "911" shall be the designated number for 573 all emergency, medical, calamity, disaster, peace and order concerns. The City Government of 574 Surigao shall procure and/or purchase the necessary technology, equipment, hardware, resources 575 and facilities for the commencement and operation of this ordinance. 576 577 Section 5. EMERGENCY SYSTEM. There shall be an Emergency and Medical Response 578 579 Center (EMRC) to be established in an office to be designated by the CDRRMO. The EMRC shall 580 be the only agency that will answer all emergency calls from the "911 number" and shall dispatch 581 the needed response team by coordinating to the respective volunteer or government agency that is near the area of incidence, calamity or disaster. 582 583 Section 6. ON-SCENE FIRST RESPONDERS. Private volunteers who are first on-scene 584 during crisis/emergency can help the victims right away however they will need to coordinate to the 585 586 CDRRMO or 911 systems for proper documentation and to avoid response redundancy. 587 Section 7. DATABASE. The EMRC shall have a digital database that will store every 588 important information in every distress call such as and not limited to the number of the caller, the 589 name of the caller, nature of incident, the names of the responders and the date and time of the 590 Incident. The information will be stored for five years and can only be disclosed if by a court order in 591 592 compliance to Republic Act 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012. 593 594 Section 8. BARANGAY COORDINATION. All Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council members shall have a close coordination with EMRC and must also encourage 595 its constituents to make use of the 911 number in cases of emergency, calamity, disaster, peace and 596 597 order concerns. 598 599 Section 9. INFORMATION DRIVE. The Surigao City Public Information Office shall promote the "911 number" and EMRC through all social and mass media agencies especially to the Surigao 600 601 City website and 602 603 Surigao City Government controlled social media pages. The volunteer emergency response teams are also urged to promote the same to their respective reach. All Punong Barangays are also 604 605 enjoined to promote the same to their respective communities. 606 Section 10. ACCREDITATION OF COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS. All Punong Barangays 607 608 are required to have all their community volunteers for emergency response be accredited by the CDRRMO The guidelines for such accreditation should be set forth by the CDRRMO. 609 610 611 Section 11. Emergency 911 Committee. There shall be an Emergency 911 Committee that shall be established for the implementation of this ordinance and continuous updating of the national 612 emergency and disaster response guidelines.
