163 *Thank you. This committee report was referred to us, denominated as Urgent, with two (2)*
164 *indorsement from the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing the*
165 *City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumalo II to enter into a Service Contract Agreement (SCA) between the*
166 *LGU-Surigao City and Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) – Caraga*
167 *Region, for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVSC) Program of*
168 *the LTFRB.*
169

170 *And with this, the Committee on Transportation, Communication and Utilities acted on the*
 171 *request of the City Mayor, and the Local Government Unit of Surigao is identified by the Land*
 172 *Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board – Caraga Region as one of its Co-Implementors*
 173 *of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVS) Program of the LTFRB, where the initiative*
 174 *of this program is to provide cash subsidies through payouts for contracting public transport services*
 175 *to affected public utility vehicle drivers while ensuring the efficiency and safety of public transport*
 176 *services and “facilitate the broad engagement of public transport cooperatives, associations, or*
 177 *corporations operating in the jurisdiction of the identified Local Government Unit.” This is a form of*
 178 *program subsidizing the transportation operations of the qualified operator by the LTFRB to*
 179 *encourage high service standards and enhance the overall commuting experience of the public.*

180
 181 *Our Local Government Unit of Surigao has been chosen to be part of this program for the*
 182 *second time. On November 30, 2023, we issued SP Resolution No. 270, Series of 2023, which*
 183 *authorized the City Mayor to enter into a Service Contract Agreement with LTFRB for 2023. This*
 184 *time, the request is for participation for the year 2024, under the General Appropriation Act of 2023.*

185
 186 *Recommendations: our committee has reviewed the proposed Service Contract Agreement*
 187 *for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting Program of the LTFRB, and*
 188 *we find it advantageous and beneficial to our public transport and qualified operators, as well as, to*
 189 *the commuters. We recommend the passing of a resolution authorizing the City Mayor Pablo Yves*
 190 *L. Dumlao II to enter into the Service Contract Agreement between the Local Government Unit of*
 191 *Surigao and the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) – Caraga Region,*
 192 *for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting Program of the LTFRB.*

 194 *Mr. Chair, I move for the adoption of my committee report. I so move.*

 209 **WHEREAS**, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the City
 210 Mayor, requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing him Enter into a Service Contract
 211 Agreement (SCA) between LGU-Surigao City and Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory
 212 Board (LTFRB)- Caraga Region, for the implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service
 213 Contracting (PUVSC) Program of the LTFRB;

214
 215 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the special provisions of Republic Act (R.A.) No. 11936, otherwise
 216 known as the General Appropriations Act of 2023 (GAA 2023), the Public Utility Vehicle Service
 217 Contracting (PUVSC) Program shall be implemented in partnership with identified and qualified Local
 218 Government Units (LGUs) to facilitate the broad engagement of public transport cooperatives,
 219 associations, or corporations operating within their jurisdiction;

220
 221 **WHEREAS**, the LTFRB is mandated under R.A. No. 11936, or the GAA 2023, to be the
 222 principal implementing Agency of the program;

223
 224 **WHEREAS**, the LTFRB shall provide a Service Plan for onboarded PUV operators, monitor
 225 the submission of PUVSC reports, coordinate with the LGU for proper implementation of the
 226 program, ensure payment to PUV operators based on the Payment Scheme in accordance with labor

227 laws and other prevailing laws, and conduct activities necessary for the proper implementation of the
 228 program;

229

230 **WHEREAS**, the LGU shall designate a focal person, coordinate with the LTFRB, provide
 231 certification of temporary rerouting plans or modified route structures, submit necessary reports,
 232 assist in the resolution of issues, participate in stakeholders' consultations, and perform other
 233 functions necessary for the proper administration and efficient operations of the program;

234

235 **WHEREAS**, the OPERATOR shall undergo orientation, provide necessary information to the
 236 LTFRB, ensure payment of salaries and wages to respective drivers and other personnel, comply
 237 with the conditions of the program, ensure that all drivers hold valid Professional Driver's Licenses,
 238 ensure onboarded units are in good condition, ensure availability of 100% of unit trips, comply with
 239 existing LTFRB policies, and submit the Certificate of Payment of Regular Payout;

240

241 **WHEREAS**, the GPS PROVIDER shall provide certification of operational GPS devices,
 242 provide monitoring access to the LTFRB and LGU, monitor authorized units, submit GPS Trip Report
 243 Certifications, and ensure availability of log reports and other data;

244

245 **WHEREAS**, regular payouts shall be computed on a weekly basis and processed by the
 246 LTFRB upon submission of the GPS Trip Report Certification, with the regular payout being
 247 computed based on the number of trips per week and the rate per trip;

248

249 **NOW THEREFORE**, on motion of Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra, seconded by
 250 Honorable Joseph Joey S. Yuipco, it was unanimously

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252 **RESOLVED:** To pass a resolution authorizing the Honorable City Mayor Pablo Yves L.
 253 Dumlao II to enter into Service Contract Agreement Between the Local Government Unit of Surigao
 254 and the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) – Caraga Region, for the
 255 implementation of the Public Utility Vehicle Service Contracting (PUVSC) program of the LTFRB.

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267 *The Committee report, Mr. Chairman deals on the City Housing Board Resolution No. 2,*
 268 *Series of 2023.*

269

270 *Facts: The City Appraisal Committee passed Resolution No. 7, Series of 2022, recommending that*
 271 *the value of lots awarded to qualified beneficiaries of socialized housing and resettlement projects of*
 272 *the City of Surigao should have a face value of Eight Hundred Pesos (Php 800.00) per square meter.*
 273 *This resolution of the City Appraisal Committee was adopted by the City Housing Board when it*
 274 *passed City Housing Board Resolution No. 2, Series of 2023.*

275

276 *A committee hearing was held on the matter by the Committee on Urban Development and Land*
 277 *Use, and during the discussions, it was pointed out that there are other resettlement*
 278 *sites of the city government and in the future, there will be others which will be located in other*
 279 *barangays where the valuation of the lots are different from that of Barangay Canlanipa.*
 280 *During the committee hearing, a representative from the City Planning and Development*
 281 *Office informed the Committee that there is another resolution passed by the City Housing*
 282 *Board which still has to be signed by the City Mayor which take into consideration the fact that*

283 *other resettlement sites may be established in the future in other barangays other than*
 284 *Barangay Canlanipa.*

285

286 *Recommendation: The Committee, therefore, recommends that the matter be endorsed back to the*
 287 *City Planning and Development Office and internally request the CPDO to endorse the new*
 288 *resolutions of the City Housing Board to the Sangguniang Panlungsod.*

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WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the City Mayor, requesting the City Council for the passage of a resolution adopting the City Housing Board Resolution No. 2, Series of 2023, Favorably Endorsing Resolution No. 7, Series of 2022 of the City Appraisal Committee;

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WHEREAS, the City Appraisal Committee passed Resolution No. 7, Series of 2022, recommending that the value of lots awarded to qualified beneficiaries of socialized housing and resettlement projects in the City of Surigao be set at Eight Hundred Pesos (Php 800.00) per square meter;

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WHEREAS, the City Housing Board adopted this recommendation by passing City Housing Board Resolution No. 2, Series of 2023;

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WHEREAS, during the committee hearing held by the Committee on Urban Development and Land Use, it was pointed out that future resettlement sites might be established in other barangays, which may have different lot valuations compared to Barangay Canlanipa;

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WHEREAS, a representative from the City Planning and Development Office (CPDO) informed the Committee about another resolution passed by the City Housing Board that addresses future resettlement sites in other barangays, which is still pending the City Mayor's signature;

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NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Jose Expeditus B. Bayana, seconded by Honorable Joseph Joey S. Yuipco, it was unanimously

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RESOLVED: To pass a resolution endorsing back City Housing Board Resolution No. 2, Series of 2023, to the City Planning and Development Office (CPDO).

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RESOLVED FURTHER: That copies of this resolution be furnished the Honorable City Mayor and City Planning and Development Office (CPDO), for their information.

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HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

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Mr. Chairman, this is a joint Committee Report by the Committees on Urban Development and Land Use as well as the Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries.

JOINT COMMITTEE REPORT
Committee on Urban Development and Land Use
and Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries

Subject of the Report: *Request of the City Mayor to be Allowed to Enter into a Usufruct Agreement with the Philippine Carabao Center to Allow the Philippine Carabao Center to Use a Parcel of Land Owned by the City Government Located at Barangay Trinidad.*

Facts: *Incidentally, there was already a Memorandum of Agreement authorized by the Sangguniang Panlungsod for the City Government at the Philippine Carabao Center in relation to the establishment for a carabao-based business improvement network.*

Both the Committees would recommend the grant of an authority to the City Mayor for him to enter into a usufruct agreement with the Philippine Carabao Center, subject to the following amendments to the usufruct agreement:

1. *Responsibilities of the parties- Letter a, number 1, should be read as follow:*

“Allow the Philippine Carabao Center or PPC to use its aforementioned land and building exclusively for the latter’s dairy processing and marketing plan without any monetary consideration for a period of (5) years renewable upon agreement of the parties.”

2. *Venue of action- It should read as follows:*

“Any legal action, suit or proceeding arising out of or relating of this agreement or the transactions contemplated therein may only be instituted in the proper courts of the City of Surigao, to the exclusion of all other courts.”

Recommendation: *With the amendments, the Committees on Agriculture as well as Urban Development and Land Use recommends the grant of an authority to the City Mayor to enter into a usufruct agreement with the Philippine Carabao Center.*

May I move Mr. Chairman for the adoption of the joint committee report.

The motion to adopt the committee report was approved. Thereafter, a motion was presented and favorably seconded and approved, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement of the City Mayor, requesting for an authority for him to enter into the Usufruct Agreement with the Philippine Carabao Center (PCC), to allow PCC to use the LGU's parcel of land and building situated at Barangay Trinidad exclusively for the latter's dairy processing plant for the establishment of a Province wide Carabao-Based Business Improvement Network under the Carabao-Based Enterprise Development Program;

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ORDINANCE NO. 514

Series of 2024

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**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE EMERGENCY AND MEDICAL
RESPONSE CENTER OF SURIGAO CITY, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF AND FOR
OTHER PURPOSES.**

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WHEREAS, Section 4 and 5, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states that, "The
prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people, and that the maintenance of peace
and order, protection of life liberty and property, and the promotion of general welfare are essential
for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy":

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WHEREAS, the frequency natural disasters and the threat to peace and order posed by the
criminality and other disturbances require the dedicated efforts of both the government and the
private sector;

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WHEREAS, there is a need to improve public safety services and existing peace and order
and public safety mechanisms by providing a clear command structure for responsibility and
accessibility and by encouraging and facilitating the prompt deployment of a seamless emergency
services;

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WHEREAS, there is a need to establish a centralized system that will strengthen the
emergency response of Surigao City to further increase the survival rate of its constituents and
maximize existing logistics and manpower;

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NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Surigao
in session assembled that:

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Section 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as an "Ordinance Establishing the
Emergency and Medical Response Center of Surigao City."

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Section 2. COVERAGE. The Ordinance shall be implemented within the whole jurisdiction
of Surigao City and shall include all medical, emergency, disaster, peace and order response
personnel whether volunteers or not.

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SECTION 2. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. Should any provision of this Ordinance be
subsequently declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not so declared shall remain
in force and effect.

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Section 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

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- (a) **CDRRMO** - City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office;
- (b) **SCPO** - Surigao City Police Office;
- (c) **CSWDO** - City Welfare and Social Development Office;
- (d) **Disaster** refers to a serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society involving widespread human, material economic or environmental losses and impacts, which exceeds the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources;

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- (e) **Emergency** refers to an unforeseen or sudden occurrence, especially danger, demanding immediate action; and
- (f) **Response** refers to any concerted effort by two (2) or more agencies, public or private, to provide assistance or intervention during or immediately after a disaster to meet the life preservation and basic subsistence needs of those people affected and in the restoration of essential public activities and facilities

Section 4. DESIGNATED NUMBER. The number "911" shall be the designated number for all emergency, medical, calamity, disaster, peace and order concerns. The City Government of Surigao shall procure and/or purchase the necessary technology, equipment, hardware, resources and facilities for the commencement and operation of this ordinance.

Section 5. EMERGENCY SYSTEM. There shall be an Emergency and Medical Response Center (EMRC) to be established in an office to be designated by the CDRRMO. The EMRC shall be the only agency that will answer all emergency calls from the "911 number" and shall dispatch the needed response team by coordinating to the respective volunteer or government agency that is near the area of incidence, calamity or disaster.

Section 6. ON-SCENE FIRST RESPONDERS. Private volunteers who are first on-scene during crisis/emergency can help the victims right away however they will need to coordinate to the CDRRMO or 911 systems for proper documentation and to avoid response redundancy.

Section 7. DATABASE. The EMRC shall have a digital database that will store every important information in every distress call such as and not limited to the number of the caller, the name of the caller, nature of incident, the names of the responders and the date and time of the Incident. The information will be stored for five years and can only be disclosed if by a court order in compliance to Republic Act 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012.

Section 8. BARANGAY COORDINATION. All Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council members shall have a close coordination with EMRC and must also encourage its constituents to make use of the 911 number in cases of emergency, calamity, disaster, peace and order concerns.

Section 9. INFORMATION DRIVE. The Surigao City Public Information Office shall promote the "911 number" and EMRC through all social and mass media agencies especially to the Surigao City website and

Surigao City Government controlled social media pages. The volunteer emergency response teams are also urged to promote the same to their respective reach. All Punong Barangays are also enjoined to promote the same to their respective communities.

Section 10. ACCREDITATION OF COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS. All Punong Barangays are required to have all their community volunteers for emergency response be accredited by the CDRRMO The guidelines for such accreditation should be set forth by the CDRRMO.

Section 11. Emergency 911 Committee. There shall be an Emergency 911 Committee that shall be established for the implementation of this ordinance and continuous updating of the national emergency and disaster response guidelines. The Committee will be composed of the following:

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 628 **Section 12. POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE EMERGENCY 911**
 629 **COMMITTEE.** The Emergency 911 Committee shall have the following powers and functions:

- 632 (b) Approve policies, plans and programs, and strategic objectives for the purpose
- 633 of prioritizing on-scene disaster response operations;
- 634 (c) Recommend the deputation of appropriate agencies and individuals for the
- 635 enforcement and implementation of this ordinance; and
- 636 (d) Issue orders, rules and regulations for the demobilization of disaster-related
- 637 resources and logistical requirements.

639 **Section 13. BUDGET.** The budget for the implementation of this ordinance will be taken
 640 from the CDRRMO Funds and Other General Funds in order to defray all the necessary expenses it
 641 may incur relative to its enactment.

 643 **Section 14. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any part of this ordinance is declared as
 644 unconstitutional or unlawful, such declaration shall not affect the other parts or the section hereof
 645 that are not declared unlawful or unconstitutional

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 647 **Section 15. REPEALING CLAUSE.** All previous ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance
 648 shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly

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 650 **Section 16. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its
