*Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and to my colleagues. My committee report pertains to the request of our City Mayor to this council authorizing him to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Field Office Region XIII, Butuan City for the implementation of Supplementary Feeding Program (SPF) for CY 2024.*

**FINDINGS/FACTS:**

*As I reviewed, this program concerns the DSWD 14th Cycle Implementation of Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) for our enrolled children in 54 Barangays of the city. It will provide additional meals to children who may not have access to adequate food at home and addressing malnutrition, promoting healthy growth and development of the city.*

*My recommendation, Mr. Chairman, may I move, Mr. Chairman for the adoption of my committee report.*

177 **WHEREAS**, the Sanngguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the City  
 178 Mayor requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing for him to enter into a  
 179 Memorandum of Agreement with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Field  
 180 Office XIII, Butuan City, for the implementation of Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP) for CY  
 181 2024;

182  
 183 **WHEREAS**, most recent data from the Expanded Convention Survey conducted by the Food  
 184 and Nutrition Research Institute of the Department of Science and Technology (FNRI-DOST)  
 185 revealed that the alleviation of undernutrition in children and other vulnerable age groups still needs  
 186 greater collective effort;

187  
 188 **WHEREAS**, the 2021 of the Family Income and Expenditure Surveys (FIES) of the Philippine  
 189 Statistics Authority is the first major survey of household income and expenditure following the on-  
 190 set of the COVID-19 pandemic. According to the latest report, in 2021, expenditure of food remained  
 191 to have biggest share in total expenditure of Filipino families;

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 194 **WHEREAS**, the Department of Social Welfare and Development, in its mandate to provide  
 195 social welfare and development programs particularly through technical assistance and resource  
 196 augmentation, is providing nutrition services to its clients at the local level through the center-based  
 197 and community-based services in partnership with Non-Government Organizations under the  
 198 Program Management Bureau, such as the Food for School and Healthy Start Feeding Program in  
 199 day care centers which were previously implemented nutrition programs of the Department;

200  
 201 **WHEREAS**, malnutrition among children is a problem that needs to be addressed by the  
 202 government, children are at risk of malnutrition should also be given equal consideration to prevent  
 203 them from becoming malnourished;

204  
 205 **NOW THEREFORE**, on motion of Honorable Joenil B. Aldonza, seconded by Honorable  
 206 Joseph Joey S. Yuipco, it was unanimously

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 208 **RESOLVED:** To pass a resolution in authorizing the Honorable City Mayor Pablo Yves L.

224 **SUBJECT:**

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226 *Adoption and approval of the City Development Council (CDC) Resolution No. 05, Series of*  
 227 *2024, entitled Approving and Endorsing the Proposed Master Plan for the Fish Port with Refrigeration*  
 228 *Facilities at Barangay Washington.*

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230 **FACTS/FINDINGS:**

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232 *Last April 24, 2024 the City Development Council (CDC) of Surigao City passed City*  
 233 *Development Council (CDC) Resolution No. 05, series of 2024 entitled "A resolution Approving and*  
 234 *endorsing the Proposed Master Plan for the Fish Port with Refrigeration Facilities at Barangay*  
 235 *Washington" and this was endorsed to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for the adoption and*  
 236 *approval of the said resolution. The City Development Council's resolution aligns with the national*  
 237 *program on agricultural infrastructure for food security and productivity and the city's strategic growth*  
 238 *in economy and development. Providing substantial benefits to the local economy and improving the*  
 239 *livelihood of local fishermen and traders. The proposed Master Plan for the construction of a fish port*  
 240 *with refrigeration facilities at Barangay Washington came from the Philippine Fisheries Development*  
 241 *Authority. The project is funded by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA).*

242

243 *During the committee hearings, it was emphasized that the proposed Master Plan must take*  
 244 *into consideration the practicality and appropriateness of the requirements set upon the Local*  
 245 *Government Unit (LGU) of Surigao so that it will not cause delays to avail the project from the PFDA*  
 246 *and secure other government permits.*

247

248 *Moreover, the LGU has already completed to date the relocation of the informal settlers*  
 249 *affected by the project to which they have been each given a lot at Sitio Bioborjan, Barangay Rizal*  
 250 *and financial assistance of ten thousand pesos (Php10,000.00).*

251

252 **RECOMMENDATION:**

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254 *The Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure finds the proposed Master Plan for the*  
 255 *fish port with refrigeration facilities at Barangay Washington to be a valuable and strategic*  
 256 *development for Surigao City. The Committee recommends the immediate adoption and approval*  
 257 *of the CDC's Resolution No. 05, Series of 2024, "A resolution Approving and endorsing the Proposed*  
 258 *Master Plan for the Fish Port with Refrigeration Facilities at Barangay Washington" with emphases*  
 259 *that the Proposed Master Plan considers the practicality and appropriateness of the requirements*  
 260 *set upon the LGU of Surigao. This measure is crucial to prevent delays in the project's grants and*

295 consider the practicality and appropriateness of the requirements set upon the Local Government  
296 Unit of Surigao to avoid delays in availing the project from the PFDA and in securing other necessary  
297 government permits;

300 relocation of informal settlers affected by the project, providing them with lot at Sitio Bioborjan,  
301 Barangay Rizal, along with financial assistance amounting to Ten Thousand Pesos (P10,000.00) per

 387 a beneficiary of the city housing project due to ownership of a parcel of land located in Barangay  
 388 Rizal, Surigao City, as well as the fact that she will not qualify as an indigent because she is receiving  
 389 a retirement pension. In Resolution No. 10, Series of 2024, a person affected by the construction of  
 390 the flood control project along Kinabutan River, Purok Kalipayan, Villa Corito, Barangay Washington,  
 391 which is a project of the Department of Public Works and Highways, was likewise denied the status  
 392 of beneficiary of the city housing project due to the fact that he has sufficient income as an organic  
 393 employee of the Department of Education.

**HON. BALTAZAR C. ABIAN:**

*Good afternoon, Mr. Chair and to my colleagues. Committee report on Committee on Trade, Industry, Business and Economic Enterprises.*

**SUBJECT:**

*REINDORSEMENT FROM THE CITY MAYOR, REQUEST OF LUCKY FORTUNE GAMING CORPORATION (LFGC) UNDER THE LICENSE OF TRIPLE DIAMOND GAMING, INC. REQUESTING FOR A RESOLUTION OF NO OBJECTION (RONO) FOR THE SET-UP AND OPERATION OF BETTING STATIONS OR GAMING SITES FOR SPECIALTY GAMES WITHIN THE CITY OF SURIGAO.*

**FACTS / FINDINGS:**

*A letter of intent, along with essential documents, including the sales agent agreement between Triple Diamond Gaming Corporation, SEC Registration, BIR Certificate of Registration, and PAGCOR Certificate of Accreditation, was submitted to the City Mayor's office by Mr. Damasus Wong. The purpose of the submission was to seek a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) for establishing and operating betting stations or gaming sites for specialty games within the jurisdiction Surigao city. Subsequently, the request was forwarded to the Sangguniang Panlungsod for further consideration. Upon careful examination of the request, this committee finds that the request pertains solely to obtaining a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) from the Sangguniang Panlungsod, allowing lucky fortune gaming corporation to establish and manage betting stations or gaming sites for specialty games within the city of Surigao. it is important to note that this request does not encompass a petition for a grant to operate within the city of Surigao, as such authority falls exclusively within the purview of Philippine Amusement Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR).*

**RECOMMENDATION:**

*Lucky Fortune Gaming Corporation plans to introduce specialty games, which are designed to provide entertainment and recreational options for the residents and visitors of Surigao. Allowing Lucky Fortune Gaming Corporation (LFGC) to set-up and operate provides certain benefits such as economic benefit and employment opportunities. The Committee on Trade, Business, Industry and Economic Enterprise recommends the passage of a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) of Lucky Fortune Gaming Corporation (LFGC) for the set-up and operation of betting stations or gaming sites for specialty games within the City of Surigao.*

*Mr. Chair, I move for the adoption of my committee report. So, I so move.*

The motion to adopt the committee report was approved while Honorable Bayana abstained from voting for the approval of the committee report. Thereafter, a motion was presented which was favorably approved.

During the discussion, the list of attendees during the public hearing with regard the set-up and operation of the betting stations was presented wherein Honorable Bayana remarked that the invited guests should have not been limited to the nearest schools and places of worships as this involves the entire Surigao City.

**HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:**

548            *Among the requirements, it is not what is under the rules of PAGCOR Mr. Chairman. This is*  
 549 *not whether or not the churches or schools near the operating site will not object to the operation. It*  
 550 *is not. What is stated in the rules of PAGCOR is that the distance of these schools, and there is no*  
 551 *statement whether or not they would agree to the operations or not, is not less than 200 meters from*  
 552 *the place of operation. To be exact, it should not be less than 200 meters from schools and places*  
 553 *of worship as certified by a geodetic engineer. Now my question is, do we have a certification from*  
 554 *a geodetic engineer that the place of operation is not less than 200 meters from schools and places*  
 555 *of worship?*

556

557 **HON. BALTAZAR C. ABIAN:**

559            *Actually, Kagawad Bayana the requirements of that business at the bingo station, only adton*

 1063 c) *Familiarize the teens of all laws and policies that concern them; and*  
 1064 d) *Sustain their respective organizational programs and projects.*

1065

1066 3. *Facilitate and monitor all activities pertaining to teen development;*

1067

1068 4. *Coordinate and link up with other agencies whether the government or*  
 1069 *private for teen welfare and development; and*

1070

1071 5. *Create such other committees and bodies as it may deem necessary to attain*  
 1072 *the objectives of this ordinance.*

1073

1074 **Section 7. CREATION OF TEEN DESKS IN THE 54 BARANGAYS OF SURIGAO AND**  
 1075 **COUNCIL.** Teen desks shall likewise be established in each and every barangay of Surigao. They  
 1076 shall be under the care and management of the Teen Desk Council of each concerned  
 1077 barangay, which shall be composed of the following:

1078

1079 Team Leader : Sangguniang Kabataan Chairperson of the Barangay  
 1080 Members : Barangay Councilor Committee on Social Services  
 1081 : Barangay Councilor Committee on Health  
 1082 : Barangay Councilor Committee on Education  
 1083 : Barangay Health Worker  
 1084 : Child Development Worker  
 1085 : Religious Sector Representative  
 1086 : School Population and Development Coordinator (POPDEV Coordinator)

1087

1088 The Teen Desk Council shall perform similar functions to that of the Surigao City Teen  
 1089 Center Council or as may be delegated and/or ordered by the latter.

1090

1091 **Section 8. FUNDING.** The funding for the Surigao City Teen Center shall be sourced from  
 1092 Gender and Development (GAD) Funds of the City. On the other hand, funding for Barangay Teen  
 1093 Desk shall be taken from the GAD Funds and/ or Sangguniang Kabataan Funds of each barangay.

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**Section 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If for any reason any part of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**Section 10. REPEALING CLAUSE.** Any or all ordinances, rules, and regulations that are inconsistent or in conflict with the sections or provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, revoked, and modified accordingly.

**Section 11. EFFECTIVITY.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
