It was also stated in the draft MOA that the Drug Screening Laboratory should be duly accredited by the Department of Health – Bureau of Health Facilities and Services.

In addition, this MOA is a requirement by the said, any laboratory screening to conduct such mandatory drug testing, Mr. Chairman.

So, the recommendation. The Committee on Health and Sanitation hereby recommends to pass a resolution authorizing the City Mayor a Blanket Authority to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with any accredited Drug Screening Laboratory to conduct Mandatory Random Drug Testing of Methamphetamine and Tetrahydrocannabinol to the employees of the City Government of Surigao City.

This question is address to my Pañero, Atty. Silvosa. What will be the sanctions or penalty for one if he refuses to undergo this mandatory drug testing? Second question is, if ever a person or a government employee or a job order employee for that matter, will be found positive of drug use what will be his faith?

ATTY. JOSHUA LEX U. SILVOSA/CITY LEGAL OFFICER:

For the first question, Mr. Chair, as to the question on whether what will happen to the employee, if he will not allow himself to be tested for drug test this is a direct insubordination because this will be in partnership with HR and those who will not allow themselves to be tested if they are chosen then this is a ground for dismissal because there is direct insubordination on the part of the employee or those who are contract or job order positions. As for those who are found positive with the use of methamphetamine or marijuana, Doc will explain also what will be the consequences but firstly, he will be investigated. One of those is for confirmatory which will be also shouldered by still by the winning bidder para sigurado gajod na positive sija and if ma-found gihapon sija positive then Doc unoy ato himoon?

DR. ERBEN C. ORPILLA/ASST. CITY HEALTH OFFICER:

 Actually, when they're found positive there are two ways, we have to note, if it is the patient is a pusher or user as well, so, there are two ways for that one. There's another treatment for that, its CBDRP we can recommend that one if found positive. There's specific guidelines when a patient is positive after investigation, so hindi dinadala agad sa kulungan, iniimbestigahan po muna.

HON, ALFONSO S. CASURRA/PRESIDING OFFICER:

Yes, go ahead, Councilor Azarcon.

On other words, Mr. Chairman, the penalty for a government employee who refuses to undergo mandatory drug testing is a possible dismissal from government service. FACTS/FINDINGS:

During the committee hearing, it was established that there will be a new secondary school (Grade 7-8) which will situated in Barangay Luna specifically behind the Surigao City Bus Terminal. The land of which the school will be constructed was already donated to the Department of Education. And one of the requirements of the Department of Education-Surigao City when establishing new schools is a memorandum of agreement with the Local Government Unit with regards to the maintenance, hiring of teachers and financial support of the said structure through the Special Education Fund. It was agreed that there is no exact amount stated in the MOA but what is needed is the implied understanding that the elementary school will be given an appropriation by the city through the special education fund when an appropriation is available.

Meaning, the applications for registration, transfer, and the reactivation as well as the correction of entries. So, the COMELEC is appealing to the public that the last day should not be something to be waited by the public. Instead, we'll make use of these remaining three days and we're open even on Saturday.

 And the second date to be remembered is the last day to file the opposition to this applications which will be on October 7, 2024. So this is the time that the public or anyone could question the applications filed in our office. And the last one in relation to the registration of voters is October 14, 2024 and thereafter because the days of the ERB hearing will depend on the number of applicants.

So the first day should be October 14, 2024. To move on, we have here a summary of the important dates, the important calendar of activities of the Commission on Elections in relation to the 2025 National and Local Elections. So we'll be giving emphasis on the September 30 last day of registration. And...
