A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR PABLO YVES L. DUMLAO II TO ENTER INTO THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT (DSWD) CARAGA REGION, FOR THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND RESOURCE AUGMENTATION (TARA) PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the Office of the City Mayor, requesting the city council to authorize the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Social Welfare and Development for the Technical Assistance and Resource Augmentation (TARA) Program;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that Local Government Units shall exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as necessary, appropriate, or incidental to efficient and effective provision of the social welfare services and facilities which include programs and projects on child and youth welfare, family and community welfare, women's welfare, welfare of the elderly and disabled persons; community-based rehabilitation programs for vagrants, beggars, street children, scavengers, juvenile delinquents, and victims of drug abuse; livelihood and other pro-poor projects; nutrition services; and family planning services;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 15, s. 1998, as amended by Executive Order No. 221, s. 2003 states that the DSWD is mandated to provide assistance to local government units (LGUs), non-government organizations (NGOs), other national government agencies (NGAs), people's organizations (POs) in effectively implementing programs, projects, and services that will alleviate poverty and empower disadvantaged individuals, families, and communities for an improved quality of life as well as implement statutory and specialized programs which are directly lodged with the Department and/or not yet devolved to LGUs;

WHEREAS, DSWD Memorandum Circular No. 10, s. 2018 provides that the DSWD assists LGUs/Local Social Welfare and Development Offices by providing direction for the SWD sector through pertinent policies and plans enriching SWD programs and services for individuals, families, and communities at risk or in need, and, affording social protection for the poor, the vulnerable and the disadvantaged in localities. These undertakings are manifested through the Technical Assistance and Resource Augmentation (TARA) Program of the DSWD;

WHEREAS, under the TARA program of the same MC, Technical Assistance (TA) consists of non-monetary interventions in the following forms, which are designed to enhance the capability of LSWDOs based on needs assessment, for the effective implementation of SWD programs, projects, and services such as training, training of trainers, orientation, demonstration session, workshop, forum, consultation or sharing session, conference, coaching and mentoring;

WHEREAS, pursuant to DSWD Administrative Order No. 02, s. 2024 with subject, "Adopting and Implementing the DSWD Strategic Plan from 2024-2028", one of the strategic objectives of the Department is to increase the capacities of LGUs in the social welfare and development services through enhancing the design and implementation of TAAORSS and institutionalization of Reward and Incentive Package of LGUs.";

WHEREAS, the LGU shall submit its 3-year Technical Assistance Plan to the DSWD for which shall serve as the basis of the DSWD in the provision of non-monetary interventions to the LGU to enhance the capability of SWO for the effective implementation of SWD programs, projects and services;

WHEREAS, the DSWD and LGU share a common vision to protect, promote, and uphold the welfare and interest of the poor, vulnerable, and disadvantaged individuals, families, and communities;

WHEREAS, the DSWD is committed to provide the necessary technical assistance to the LGU pursuant to the approved 3-year plan;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Joenil B. Aldonza, jointly seconded by Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra and Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo, it was unanimously

And concluded, with the support of the implementation, it aims to positively laddered for the nutrition needs of the Surigaonon.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the Office of the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to authorize the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)- Caraga, the "Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program";

WHEREAS, by virtue of Presidential Executive Order No. 44, series of 2023, the "Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program" of the DSWD was declared as a Flagship Program of the National Government, with the DSWD as the lead implementing agency responsible for its management and execution;

WHEREAS, the "Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program" aims to decrease the incidence of involuntary hunger experienced by low-income families through the provision of Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) Cards, which can be used to purchase select food commodities at eligible partner stores and merchants;

WHEREAS, the DSWD is mandated to work with other National Government Agencies (NGAs) and Local Government Units (LGUs) for the program's implementation, requiring full support and cooperation to ensure effective execution;

WHEREAS, the DSWD Central Office has delegated the DSWD FO Caraga to coordinate with the LGU of Surigao for the implementation of the "Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program";

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Joenil B. Aldonza, jointly seconded by Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra and Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo, it was unanimously

RESOLVED: To pass a resolution authorizing the Honorable City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumlao II to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)- Caraga, the "Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program".

HON. JOSHUA EMILIO S. GELI:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Good afternoon again to my colleagues. This is a committee report, first with the Committee on Health and Sanitation. Subject of which is...

A resolution authorizing the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Department of Health (DOH) to enter into a collaborative approach in the provision of services related to HIV and AIDS including access to antiretroviral drug for people living with HIV.

FACTS AND FINDINGS:

Committee hearing was held on December 4, 2024 together with the committee members and the resource persons involved. It was discussed during the said committee hearing that this initiative by the City Government is due and timely as the current cases of Surigaonons who are found to be positive in HIV are currently on an upward trend making Surigao City 2nd in number of cases in the Caraga Region. This however can also be associated with the dedication of our health care personnel who have exerted much efforts in case tracking/contract tracing of people who have tested positive. But regardless of this, the data and statistics we currently hold is just the tip of the iceberg of the current situation and much need intervention such as this is needed.

Based on the draft MOA presented, the main goal is for the City Health Office to be one of the DOH-designated treatment hubs that facilitates the provision of safe, comprehensive, and compassionate care to

HIV and AIDS patients. What is needed from the City Government is only to provide a space or clinic wherein, but not limited to testing and aftercare counseling can be done and the associated staffing, equipment and materials needed for this to function. Once the clinic is established, DOH will be the one who will provide for the antiretroviral drug needed for the maintenance of the patients who are found to be positive, which is estimated to cost patients P3000 (Three Thousand) pesos daily.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee on Health and Sanitation hereby recommends to pass a resolution to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Department of Health as presented, Mr. Chairman.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR PABLO YVES L. DUMLAO II TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH) FOR THE COLLABORATIVE APPROACH IN THE PROVISION OF SERVICES RELATED TO HIV AND AIDS INCLUDING ACCESS TO ANTIRETROVIRAL DRUG FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the Office of the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to authorize him to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Health (DOH) to enter into partnership for the collaborative approach in the provision of services related to HIV and AIDS including access to antiretroviral drug for people living with HIV;

WHEREAS, the DOH, as the lead agency of government on HIV/AIDS prevention and control, identifies both government and private health facilities, including provincial and local government hospitals as treatment hubs to provide services related to HIV and AIDS;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 22, Article 1 of RA 8504, otherwise known as the " Philippine AIDS Prevention and Control Act of 1998, " AN ACT PROMULGATING POLICIES AND PRESCRIBING MEASURES FOR THE PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF HIV/AIDS IN THE PHILIPPINES, INSTITUTING A NATIONWIDE HIV/AIDS INFORMATION AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM, ESTABLISHING A COMPREHENSIVE HIV/AIDS MONITORING SYSTEM, STRENGTHENING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL AIDS COUNCIL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, which mandates all hospitals and other appropriate health care facilities, to establish an HIV/AIDS Core Team (HACT) to oversee their implementation of policies and guidelines on all matters pertaining to HIV and AIDS in the healthcare setting, with the primary objectives of facilitating the provision of safe, comprehensive and compassionate care to HIV/AIDS patients by properly trained personnel; mobilizing hospital and community resources towards minimizing the impact of HIV/AIDS infection on the patient and his family; and coordinating all efforts to prevent and control the transmission of HIV/AIDS infection;

WHEREAS, the City Health Office is capacitated with a functional HIV and AIDS Core Team and whose members had undergone series of capacity building on the clinical management of HIV and AIDS;

WHEREAS, the DOH supports the global initiative on Universal Access that facilitated access to antiretroviral therapy and other services related to HIV and AIDS;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Joshua Emilio S. Geli, jointly seconded by Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra and Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo, it was unanimously

RESOLVED: To pass a resolution authorizing the Honorable City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumlao II to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Department of Health (DOH) for the collaborative approach in the provision of services related to HIV and AIDS including access to antiretroviral drug for people living with HIV.

COMMITTEE REPORT

Committee on Urban Development and Land Use

SUBJECT:

A Resolution Adopting the Surigao City Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) 2023-2032, specifically Volume 1 and 3 titled as “The Land Use Plan” and “Sectoral and Special Area Studies” respectively.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

Several committee hearings were conducted dated November 27, December 2, and December 4, 2024 regarding the matter wherein the committee members and the resource persons involved attended.

During the hearings, the CLUP 2023-2032, which was already approved to be indorsed to the SP during the latest City Development Council Meeting, was presented to the committee wherein the discussions were, but not limited to, presentation of the changes in the land classifications of the city, proposed new road network for city expansion projects, new infrastructure projects that are being drafted and proposed to the city. The Comprehensive Land Use Plan of the city will be used as a framework and guide for the long term goals and vision of the LGU of Surigao City in terms of the land use of its inhabitants for the next 10 years. Thorough research and public consultations were made by our urban planners in the city which resulted in this document. The implementing tool of the CLUP which is the Volume 2: Zoning Ordinance will be scheduled for another public hearing for discuss with the public with regards to its provisions. To strengthen the discussion, the Committee on Urban Development and Land Use has invited resource persons if there will be inquiries from the honorable members of the Sangguniang Panglungsod.

RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the Office of the City Mayor, forwarding to the City Council the City Zoning Review Committee Resolution, which favorably endorses the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) 2023-2032 of Surigao City with the attached references and guidance based on the following volumes of the City Land Use Plan, namely, Volume 1 titled "The Land Use Plan," Volume 2 titled "Zoning Ordinance," and Volume 3 titled "Sectoral and Special Area Studies";

WHEREAS, several committee hearings were held on November 27, December 2, and December 4, 2024, to discuss the Surigao City Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) 2023-2032, with the participation of committee members and relevant resource persons;

WHEREAS, during the hearings, the CLUP 2023-2032, which had previously been approved for endorsement to the Sangguniang Panlungsod at the recent City Development Council meeting, was presented to the committee. The discussions focused on various matters, including changes in land classifications within the city, the proposed new road network for city expansion projects, and the infrastructure projects currently being developed and proposed for the city;

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Land Use Plan will serve as a framework and guide for long-term goals and vision of the LGU of Surigao concerning land use and urban development over the next ten years. The plan was based on thorough research and public consultations conducted by the urban planners of the city;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Joshua Emilio S. Geli, jointly seconded by Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra and Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo, it was unanimously

COMMITTEE REPORT **Committee on Rules**

SUBJECT:

Indorsement from the Office of the City Mayor requesting a resolution authorizing him to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP) for the Payroll Servicing Agreement.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

During the committee hearing held on December 3, 2024, it was revealed that the payroll servicing agreement between the City Government and the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP) has been ongoing for a significant period of time.

It was noted that Paragraph 1, Section X of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), specifically under its Miscellaneous Provisions, states the following: "This agreement shall take effect upon execution of the contract for a period of one (1) year and shall be automatically renewed for another one (1) year thereafter, unless otherwise terminated, amended, modified, or supplemented in writing upon mutual consent of the parties." This clause signifies that the MOA has an automatic renewal provision, which effectively keeps the agreement in force unless either party explicitly terminates, modifies, or amends the terms in writing.

RECOMMENDATION:

Given that the automatic renewal clause of the MOA is currently in effect, the committee on Rules has determined that there is no immediate need for a resolution to authorize the City Mayor to enter into a new agreement, as the current MOA remains valid and operational.

Therefore, the committee recommends that the request from the Office of the City Mayor be remanded back with the information that the existing MOA is still valid and effective due to the automatic renewal clause.

Mr. Chairman, I move for the adoption of my committee report.

RECOMMENDATION:

Based on the findings of the committee and confirmation that the proper procedures were followed, the Committee on Rules hereby recommends the passage of a resolution declaring Barangay Ordinance No. 01, Series of 2024, of Barangay Ipil, as valid in form and substance.

This recommendation is made in consideration of the ordinance's alignment with local governance requirements and its intended purpose to address environmental and sanitation concerns within the barangay.

WHEREAS, the Committee on Rules has reviewed the ordinance and found it to be compliant with the necessary legal procedures, and aligned with local governance standards and the objective of addressing environmental and sanitation concerns within Barangay Ipil;
