A resolution authorizing the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Department of Health (DOH) to enter into a collaborative approach in the provision of services related to HIV and AIDS including access to antiretroviral drug for people living with HIV.

466 **FACTS AND FINDINGS**:

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Committee hearing was held on December 4, 2024 together with the committee members 468 and the resource persons involved. It was discussed during the said committee hearing that this 469 initiative by the City Government is due and timely as the current cases of Surigaonons who are 470 found to be positive in HIV are currently on an upward trend making Surigao City 2nd in number of 471 cases in the Caraga Region. This however can also be associated with the dedication of our health care 472 personnel who have exerted much efforts in case tracking/contract tracing of people who have tested positive. 473 474 But regardless of this, the data and statistics we currently hold is just the tip of the iceberg of the current situation and much need intervention such as this is needed. 475

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477 Based on the draft MOA presented, the main goal is for the City Health Office to be one of 478 the DOH-designated treatment hubs that facilitates the provision of safe, comprehensive, and 479 compassionate care to

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HIV and AIDS patients. What is needed from the City Government is only to provide a space
 or clinic wherein, but not limited to testing and aftercare counseling can be done and the associated
 staffing, equipment and materials needed for this to function. Once the clinic is established, DOH will
 be the one who will provide for the antiretroviral drug needed for the maintenance of the patients who
 are found to be positive, which is estimated to cost patients P3000 (Three Thousand) pesos daily.
