#### 393 HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE. JR.:

394 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The Local Finance Committee has thoroughly assessed the ongoing market collection performance of the LGU of Surigao City, with particular focus on the 395 income generated from the City Public Market. Based on its findings, the Local Finance Committee 396 397 has identified a consistent decline in market revenues, which is directly linked to non-398 implementation of the agreement between the LGU and the Philippine Primark Properties Incorporated, regarding the construction of the new City Public Market. The Local Finance 399 400 Committee's evaluation indicates that the continued delay and non-fulfillment of this project has 401 significantly affected the financial capacity of the LGU, particularly in terms of the local revenue 402 generation that supports vital city operations and services.

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404 In light of this, the Local Finance Committee has recommended that the contract with 405 Philippine Primark Properties, Inc. be rescinded to protect the financial interests of Surigao City 406 and mitigate further losses. In addition, with the LFC's recommendation, the Honorable City Mayor Pablo Yves L. Dumlao II has been urged to formally indorse the resolution to the Sangguniang 407 Panlungsod for appropriate action. This resolution seeks the approval to rescind the contract, 408 409 thereby facilitating the restoration of the lost income and the pursuit of alternative measures to revitalize the City Public Market. 410

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So, this resolution will now be presented for consideration and approval of this august body.

414 It has been fully documented, Mr. Chairman, that the City Government of Surigao City was ready to 415 turn over its public market location since last year, if I'm not mistaken. And we had several discussions with representatives of Primark, and we reiterated that we are ready to turn over the 416 property, and they have to submit to us proof that they have secured the necessary financing for 417 418 the construction of the public market. Unfortunately, Mr. Chairman, until now, they have not complied with such demand. So, I guess we have no more option but to terminate or rescind the 419 contract with the Primark. Mr. Chairman. 420

So, when we turned over the operations to them, 529 the City ceased to collect from the Public Market. Prior to that, our annual income from the 530 531 operation of the public market is around Eighteen Million (18,000,000) per annum. So, when we turned over that operation to Primark, we lost that opportunity to collect since the operation is now 532 turned over to them. They are now the ones collecting the fees for the operation of the public 533 market. So, we lost the income of 18 Million per annum. 534

In fact it is so found in item no. 23, do we have number 23?

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Further into the discussion, the resource persons believed thatPrimark incurred material breach on the amended lease agreement as it statesthat, "the lessee has certified to the lessor that it has raised the necessary financing for the construction of the improvements that such financing agreements have become binding and effective". The Primark has continuously failed to comply with this is the particular provision of the amended lease agreementand has not submitted the document showing that they have indeed raised the necessary financing for the construction of the new public market and that the financing agreement has already become binding and effective.

Although the Primark has submitted a certification from a banking institution stating that it has a credit line of Five Hundred Million, it is the opinion of the Local Finance Committee that it is insufficient to comply with the requirement stated in Section 5.7 of the amended lease agreement as the same has a disclaimer that the banking institution will not be liable to third persons that Primark will be involved with and that drawing from the said credit line still subject to certain condition.Additionally, the project cost is Eight Hundred Ten Million Pesos thereby making the credit line apparently insufficient.

I think it on the record, the first submitted a certification of which we responded upon which
we said that the certification that you issued is not to us acceptable considering that there was this

Which 712 says that they are no longer in a position to, rather the wordings here of the President Rebecca Marie Abigail Lee, says that Primark is not amenable to the submission of any other document 713 714 required by the Local Government Unit, because they feel that what they submitted with respect to the certification that was issued by the bank in the amount of Five Hundred Million 715 (500,000,000.000) as a credit facility, is already sufficient compliance with Article 5.7, of which we 716 717 said it is not. Because even in the certification that was issued by the bank it merely said, a credit line in the amount of Five Hundred Million Pesos (₱500,000,000.000). Remember that when they 718 719 presented to us here the amount that they stated it is on record that the amount of the project is 720 Eight Hundred Ten Million Pesos (₱810,000,000.00), more or less.
