My second Committee Report, Mr. Chairman, for the Public Order and Safety. The endorsement from the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to pass a Resolution authorizing the City Mayor to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Caraga Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict or Caraga-RTF-ELCAC to outline the contribution and collaborative responsibilities of Provincial and City Local Government Unit.

Findings and facts, the committee pertains to the request of our City Mayor to the City Council to pass a Resolution authorizing him to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Caraga Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict to outline the contribution and collaborative responsibilities of Provincial and City Local Government Unit.

Further, as the committee hearing conducted, the Caraga-RTF-ELCAC has a Resolution No. 5. A Resolution approving the P100,000.00 Annual Contribution of the Caraga's Regional, Provincial, and City Local Government Unit's to support the Caraga Regional Task Force to end Local Communist Armed Conflict was passed and approved during the Caraga-RTF-ELCAC CY 2024 First Quarter Meeting last March 25, 2024. As stated and presented from our Budget Official, it was already included in our Annual Budget CY 2025.

However, our City as member and contributed this Regional Task Force. It will be a positive outcome to provide a technical support, guidance, and oversight in the proper allocation and utilization of funds for programs and under the Caraga-RTF-ELCAC.

As the Committee on Public Order and Safety, it is recommended to pass a Resolution for the request of our City Mayor in authorizing him to accept a Memorandum of Agreement with the Caraga Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict to outline the contribution and collaborative responsibilities of Provincial and City Local Government.

DUMLAO II TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE CARAGA REGIONAL TASK FORCE TO END LOCAL COMMUNIST ARMED CONFLICT (CARAGA RTF-ELCAC), OUTLINING THE CONTRIBUTION AND COLLABORATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PROVINCIAL AND CITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod was in receipt of an indorsement from the City Mayor, requesting the City Council to pass a resolution authorizing him to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Caraga Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (Caraga RTF-ELCAC), outlining the contribution and collaborative responsibilities of Provincial and City Local Government Units;

WHEREAS, the Regional Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict was established pursuant to Executive Order No. 70, s. 2018, to institutionalize a whole-of-nation

283 approach in attaining inclusive and sustainable peace, focusing on addressing the root causes of
284 insurgencies, internal disturbances, and other armed conflicts and threats;

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286 **WHEREAS**, corollary to the appointment of DBM Secretary Amenah F. Pangandaman by
287 President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr. as the Cabinet Officer for Regional Development and Security
288 (CORDS) for the Caraga Region and pursuant to RTF-ELCAC Resolution No. 011, s. 2024, the DBM
289 RO XIII was identified as Co-Secretariat to the Caraga RTF-ELCAC Technical Working Group
290 (TWG);

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292 **WHEREAS**, Caraga RTF-ELCAC Resolution No. 05, s. 2024 entitled, "A Resolution
293 Approving the One Hundred Thousand Pesos (P100,000.00) Annual Contribution of the Caraga
294 Region's Provincial and City Local Government Units (P/CLUs) to Support the Caraga Regional Task
295 Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (RTF-ELCAC)", was passed and approved, was
296 passed and approved during the Caraga RTF-ELCAC CY 2024 1st Quarter Meeting on March 25,
297 2024;

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299 **WHEREAS**, Section 5 of the General Provisions (GP) of Republic Act No. 11975, FY 2024
300 General Appropriations Act, departments, bureaus, and offices of the National Government may
301 accept donations, contributions, grants, bequests, or gifts from various sources for purposes relevant
302 to their functions;

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304 **WHEREAS**, the receipts from cash donations shall be deposited with the National Treasury
305 and recorded as a Special Account in the General Fund (SAGF) and shall be available to the
306 implementing agency concerned through a Special Budget pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book
307 VI of EO No. 292;

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309 **WHEREAS**, Section 6 of the GP further provides that receipts collected or received by
310 departments, bureaus, offices, and instrumentalities of the National Government from donations
311 authorized by law or contract with a term not exceeding one (1) year shall be deposited with the
312 National Treasury and recorded as trust receipts;

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314 **WHEREAS**, the DBM RO XIII is mandated to provide technical support, guidance, and
315 oversight in the proper allocation and utilization of government funds, including those allocated for
316 the implementation of programs and projects under the RTF-ELCAC;

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318 **WHEREAS**, the DBM RO XIII opened an MDS-Trust Fund account with the Landbank of the
319 Philippines, Butuan Branch for receipts and disbursements pertaining to RTF-ELCAC financial
320 transactions;

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322 **WHEREAS**, the validity of the Notice of Cash Allocations issued within a given year shall be
323 utilized until the last working day of the same year pursuant to Item No. 4.2.1.5 of National Budget
324 Circular No. 5922 dated January 2, 2024;

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326 **WHEREAS**, in order to fully utilize within the year, the LGUs contributions for the Caraga
327 RTF-ELCAC operations, the annual contribution of the P/CLUs may be given to Caraga RTF-ELCAC
328 through the DBM RO XIII as Co-Secretariat on or before the end of the first quarter of that year;

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HON. JOSHUA EMILIO S. GELI:

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I have another Committee Report under the Committee on Health and Sanitation. Indorsement from the City Mayor, forwarding to the City Council the Local Health Board (LHB) Resolution No. 2, Series of 2024 "A Resolution requesting the Sangguniang Panlungsod to increase the Honorarium of the City-LGU charged Barangay Health Workers (BHW), Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS), and Barangay Sanitation Inspectors (BSI) and Barangay Blood Coordinating Council (BBCC)".

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Committee hearing was conducted last November 21, 2024 together with the committee members and representatives of the Executive Department, City Budget Office, Legal Department and City Health Office. It was discussed that there is a request to increase the monthly honorarium of City-LGU charged BHWs, BNS and BSI and BBC. It was positively received by the City Budget Office that they will accommodate the said request on the next ensuing year, 2025. It was also agreed upon that the matter be revert back to the executive department through the Local Finance Committee for their respective resolution if it will also be favorably approved.

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With this Mr. Chairman, the Committee on Health and Sanitation hereby recommends to revert back this matter to the executive department through the Local Finance Committee for further assessment, Mr. Chairman.

492 *upon closer scrutiny, it became evident that the ordinance is vague in certain areas, which could lead*

 533 *Congress or by Congress through legislation. Public places under the jurisdiction on Local*
 534 *Government Units except for Barangays maybe named or renamed by the Local Government Unit*
 535 *concerned. Therefore, the proposed Ordinances, proposed by ah, passed rather by Barangay Taft*
 536 *are clearly invalid for being ultra vires or beyond their legal authority.*

537

 579 *fixing the rental fees for the use of the Surigao City Auditorium and City Cultural Center and for other*
 580 *purposes, Mr. Chairman. I have given copies to the honorable members of this committee with the*
 581 *amendments highlighted as red. I've also invited our Property Custodian, Ma'am Alicia Ma for*

 607 *Mr. Chairman, my apprehension also is that, if we will pass this ordinance the less privileged*
 608 *members of society will have to rent chairs and tables from us? For example, during vigils of, during*
 609 *after the demise of their loved ones, Mr. Chairman, so they will have to rent the chairs and tables?*
 610 *Also by the way, the ordinance as worded, national line agencies even barangay, city barangays will*
 611 *have to rent the chairs and tables if they will need additional chairs and tables for official affairs?*
 612 *This is on top of the need of the less fortunate members of society, Mr. Chairman. Would this*
 613 *ordinance not be oppressive in so far as they are concerned, Mr. Chairman?*

614
 615 **HON. ALFONSO S. CASURRA/PRESIDING OFFICER:**

616
 617 Wayá, they can always argue with that?

618
 619 **HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:**

620
 621 *At any rate, we can always impose a fine for them to replace a lost or destroyed tables and*
 622 *chairs which they borrowed from the City Government.*

623
 624 **HON. ALFONSO S. CASURRA/ PRESIDING OFFICER:**

625
 626 *Do we have that provision regarding destruction or none?*

627
 628 **HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:**

629
 630 *Section 2.4 Mr. Chairman, lost/damaged. Even barangays will have to pay for the chairs and*
 631 *tables. For example they would be having an official program in their barangays, under this*
 632 *ordinance. That is why, when this was originally indorsed to the Committee on Ways and Means,*
 633 *during my time as as chairman. I had serious doubts in passing the ordinance Mr. Chairman, just to*
 634 *make it on record Mr. Chairman.*

635
 636 In cases of conflict of schedule, the management of the facilities will find a solution in order
 637 to satisfy the customer.

638
 639 **HON. JOSHUA EMILIO S. GELI:**

640
 641 *This ordinance was already passed 2019 and the only thing that we inserted was the tables*
 642 *and chairs. So, if ever we will amending more on this ordinance, for example the existing rates that*
 643 *we are already executing now to be lowered or to include another amendments with regards to*
 644 *cancellation.*

645 **HON. ALFONSO S. CASURRA/ PRESIDING OFFICER:**

646

647 *We can always move for an amendment, but the point is are we ready to have a situation*
 648 *that is also acceptable to your end. Especially with regard to cancellation of booking. That's the only*
 649 *time or rather that's the only thing that they would like to be assured that the City Government will*
 650 *also have some sets of seriousness in the way that we have to treat this ordinance na 'di sab kita*
 651 *mabutang sa, ayang ayang later on. Anyway as ah it's your pleasure Councilor Geli if we just approve*
 652 *this and then have another amendment later on. If you are talking about only the rates.*

653

654 **HON. JOSHUA EMILIO S. GELI:**

655

656 *Yes, Mr. Chairman.*

657

658 The Presiding Officer also suggested to construct another comfort rooms near the stage of
 659 the City Gym and to ensure functionality of the comfort rooms of the City Cultural Center.

660

661 There being no more queries, the resource person was excused and **RULES WERE**
 662 **REINSTATED.** Thereafter, the proponent then presented a motion to pass the proposed ordinance
 663 on second reading with the proposed amendments which was favorably seconded and approved.
