For the, the operation of the Sanitary Landfill is within the mandate of the City Environment and Natural Resources Office. 1162 For, since the operation of the sanitary landfill, we have not collected any fees due to the lack of 1163 facility to measure accurately the weight of garbage being disposed. Though we have garbage 1164 collection fees collected during for business establishments, we don't have a separate collection fee 1165 1166 for the disposal at the sanitary landfill. In the year 2023, we have started the construction of a weighbridge in the sanitary landfill and has been completed in 2024. Uhm, this weighbridge will be 1167 able to accurately measure the weight of the garbage being disposed at the sanitary landfill. 1168 1169 1170 If you can remember Mr. Chair, last year the Municipality of Madrid also requested to entering to a memorandum that they throw their solid waste here in the city. However, due to the lack 1171 of facility or the provisions or ordinance to support the, to enter into a MOA with them, we differ the 1172 MOA with them Mr. Chair. That's why as provided also in our ecological solid waste management 1173 ordinance, section 33 of the City Ordinance 488. There is also a provision for the establishment of 1174 1175 the tipping fee of ordinance Mr. Chair. 1176 1177 During the discussion, Honorable Bayana asked the resource person the definition of local entities or institutions and outside entities or institution and suggested that such definitions be 1178 1179 incorporated in the Proposed Ordinance. 1180 During the session, Hon. Sebastian Ric A. Nagas inquired about the city's solid waste 1181 1182 disposal system. City ENR Officer Engr. Jose Alfonso A. Casurra reported that there are currently three operational landfill cells, with a fourth under preparation to extend capacity for another six 1183 years. The goal is to rehabilitate the first three cells while the fourth is in use. 1184

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Hon. Nagas asked whether local and external waste disposal would use the same landfill.
 Engr. Casurra confirmed that both local and outside waste would be accommodated within capacity
 limits.

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Hon. Cacel R. Azarcon, the Presiding Officer, asked which entities utilize the facility. Engr. Casurra identified three private waste haulers (Sea Lion, Vertex, and Win Ship) and local institutions, including hospitals that dispose of general (non-hazardous) waste. He clarified that hazardous medical waste is not accepted at the landfill. Shipping companies dispose only of residual and recyclable waste.

Regarding the collection of tipping fees, Engr. Casurra explained that these fees apply to private local entities, not to government waste collection. For neighboring municipalities, a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) would be required if they wish to use the landfill. However, the City Government is not obligated to accept waste from external entities, and any such agreements are subject to the discretion of the City ENR Office.

Hon. Jose Expeditus B. Bayana raised a concern regarding whether the proposed ordinance
 explicitly allows other LGUs to dispose of their waste at the city's sanitary landfill. Engr. Jose Alfonso
 A. Casurra, the City ENRO Officer, clarified that for government-to-government arrangements, a
 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) would be necessary, but the ordinance does not currently specify
 this.

Hon. Cacel R. Azarcon, Presiding Officer, asked if there had been past requests from neighboring municipalities to use the landfill. Engr. Casurra confirmed that the Municipality of Madrid had made such a request the previous year, and Hon. Bayana noted that the request had reached the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

Recognizing that the ordinance was silent on the matter, Hon. Bayana proposed an amendment to explicitly include a section stating that other municipalities—whether from Surigao del Norte or other provinces—must secure city approval through an MOA before using the landfill. Hon. Karl Duane A. Casurra, the ordinance proponent, agreed to the amendment.

Additionally, Hon. Bayana suggested adding another provision specifying the conditions and requirements under which external entities could be allowed to dispose of waste at the sanitary landfill. Hon. Azarcon instructed Hon. Casurra to take note of the proposed amendments for inclusion in the ordinance.

1222 The discussion concluded with Hon. - d. No public auction of delinquent real properties shall be initiated by City Government during 1314 the effectivity of the amnesty period. However, upon expiration of the amnesty program, the 1315 City Treasurer may proceed with this option. 1316

SECTION 8. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS - For the effective implementation of this 1318 Ordinance, the following shall be observed: 1319

- a. The City Treasurer shall prescribe and provide the necessary application forms to be used in this program within fifteen (15) days upon approval of this Ordinance:
 - b. The City Treasurer's Office and the City Assessor's Office shall conduct intensive information drive regarding this Ordinance;
 - c. The City Treasurer shall submit quarterly reports to the City Mayor and the Sangguniang Panlungsod on the progress of this program; and
- The City Treasurer may determine or approve mode of payment either in cash or check and d. the frequency of installments for each application, which shall not exceed a one (1) year period.

SECTION 9. INFORMATION DISSEMINATION.

- a. This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation immediately upon approval; and
- b. The City Treasurer's Office and the City Assessor's Office shall conduct intensive information drive of this program, including but not limited to, coordination with the barangays for their pro-active assistance by posting tarpaulins, streamers, and posters in at least three (3) conspicuous places in their respective areas of jurisdiction or through social media platforms.

SECTION 10. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - If, for any reason, any part or provision of this 1340 Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts of provisions hereof which are not 1342 affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE - All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, 1344 1345 memorandum circulars, administrative orders, and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. 1346

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE- This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval 1348 1349 and after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation and shall end on JULY 05, 2026.
