SUBJECT:

Request for Issuance of a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) for the Establishment of a Crematorium and Columbarium by Surigao Memorial Park, Inc. (SMPI), through its Subsidiary Serenity Hills Services Inc. (SHSI), at Property Lot No. 800-A-1 Owned by Surigao Memorial Park, Inc. (SMPI).

FACTS/FINDINGS:

The Committee reviewed the request submitted by Surigao Memorial Park, Inc. (SMPI), and its subsidiary Serenity Hills Services Inc. (SHSI), for the issuance of a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) to establish and operate a crematorium and columbarium at Property Lot No. 800-A-1 located in Barangay Cagniog, Surigao City.

The proponents have substantially complied with the documentary requirements necessary for the issuance of the Resolution Of No Objection (RONO), including:

- Certificate of Registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC),
- Zonal Clearance from the City Planning and Development Office,

- Endorsement from the Sangguniang Barangay of Cagniog, Surigao City.

However, based on the Committee's assessment and clarification from the applicant, only the crematorium component has been prepared for implementation. The proposed columbarium remains a planned facility and has not yet commenced construction.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing, the Committee on Rules respectfully recommends the approval and issuance of a Resolution of No Objection (RONO) exclusively for the establishment and operation of the crematorium component at this time.

WHEREAS, the Committee on Rules has reviewed the submitted request and found that the proponents have substantially complied with the documentary requirements necessary for the issuance of the RONO, including:

- *Endorsement from the Sangguniang Barangay of Cagniog, Surigao City;*

• **Second Reading:**

Proposed Ordinance "An Ordinance Establishing The Solid Waste Management Cost Recovery Mechanism Of The City Government Of Surigao Through Charging Tipping Fees For Waste Disposal At The Sanitary Landfill, And For Other Purposes. By: Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, Honorable Noel Christian G. Catre, Jr.

Honorable Noel Christian G. Catre, Jr. was recognized and moved for the suspension of the rules to allow the resource person to join the discussion. **RULES WERE SUSPENDED.**

HON. CHRISTIAN NOEL G. CATRE, JR.:

So, we can invite Engineer Joal Casurra. Please join us. I understand this proposed ordinance was already tackled for second reading. I think it was two months ago, and this copy contains the proposed amendments of the members of this august body. But nevertheless, I suggest that we discuss this Section by Section so we can review and approve this on second reading, Mr. Chairman.

Engr. Joal, can you please read the proposed ordinance? You start with Section 1 or Section 2?

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENRO OFFICER:

Okay. Good afternoon, Mr. Chair, and to the members of this august body. For Section 2 of the proposed ordinance, we provide the different definitions of terms in the proposed ordinance. So, for definition of terms, for purposes of this ordinance,

- A. Disposal activity shall refer to actions of disposing of segregated solid waste at the sanitary landfill.
- B. Government disposal permit, a permit issued to registered Local Government Units outside Surigao City intending to dispose of solid waste at the sanitary landfill. The permit shall be valid for one year and renewable yearly.

- C. Local Disposal Rate, the tipping fee rate matrix that will be imposed on Surigao City entities, institutions, and waste hauling operators disposing of solid waste at the sanitary landfill.
- D. Local Entities shall refer to individuals, institutions, organizations, and companies whose address or business address is duly registered in Surigao City.
- E. Materials Recovery Facility include a solid waste transfer station or sorting station, drop-off center, composing facility, and recycling facility.
- F. Outside entities shall refer to *other* LGUs outside Surigao City intending to dispose of their solid waste at the sanitary landfill facility.

HON. CHRISTIAN NOEL G. CATRE, JR.:

Mr. Chairman, may I propose an amendment to Subsection F of Section 2 of the proposed ordinance. I would suggest that we delete the word other.

It should be outside entities refers only to LGU's outside Surigao City intending to dispose of their solid waste at the City Sanitary Landfill Facility.

Please proceed.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENRO OFFICER:

G. Outsider Disposal Rate, tipping fee rate matrix, shall refer to the tipping fee matrix that will be imposed to Non-Surigao City Local Government units disposing of solid waste to the sanitary landfill.

Letter H, Solid Waste Management is the purposeful and systematic control of generation, storage, collection, transport, separation, processing, recycling, recovery, and financial disposal of solid waste.

I. Regular Disposal Permit, a permit issued to registered entities that will dispose of solid waste at the sanitary landfill more than three times within a month with a validity of six months.

The permit shall expire after six months, whichever comes first, and renewable once a year.

J. Recyclable Materials, refers to any waste material retrieved from the waste stream and free from contamination that can still be converted into suitable beneficial use or for purposes including but not limited to newspapers, ferrous scrap metals, non-ferrous scrap metals, used oil, corrugated carports, aluminum, glass, office paper, tin cans, and other materials as may be determined for the said purpose.

K. Registration Certificate, refers to the certification issued to entities after completing the registration process of the City ENRO.

The registration does not constitute a permit to dispose of at the sanitary landfill.

L. Residual Waste, waste that cannot be used or recycled and needs to be disposed of properly, such as but not limited to construction debris, plastic sachets, disposable diapers and sanitary napkins, etc.

M. Special Disposal Permit, a permit issued to registered entities that will dispose of solid waste at the sanitary landfill five times with a validity of three months.

The permit shall expire after exceeding five disposal activities or after three months, whichever comes first, and shall be renewable once a year.

P. A certain compensation charge to an entity or institution for disposing of solid waste, usually measured in terms of weight or volume, into the disposal facility such as sanitary landfill.

O. Weigh Bridge, a large and heavy-duty industrial weight scale, also known as a truck scale, used to weigh vehicles and their loads, especially road trucks.

They are typically used for commercial and industrial purposes, such as determining the weight of the trucks for transportation purposes, trading, compliance with weight regulations and inventory management.

During the discussion, the Hon. Joenil B. Aldonza, the Presiding Officer, asked if the weigh bridge is operational. Engr. Jose Alfonso A. Casurra answered that it is operational in a sense for practicing for the operator, but it is not operational in a sense that they are already collecting the data.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENRO OFFICER:

Section 3, Tipping Fee Matrix. The tipping fee shall be based on the reading of the weigh bridge and shall be scaled according to the matrix provided below. For local entities or institutions, the tipping fee shall be 100 pesos for every 100 kilograms.

In the middle of the discussion, the Hon. Noel Christian G. Catre, Jr, added amendments.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

Okay. Regular Disposal Permit. A permit issued to registered entities that will dispose of solid waste at the sanitary landfill more than three times within a month. I propose that we change that into more than three times within a period of one month.

HON. JOENIL B. ALDONZA/PRESIDING OFFICER:

Three times within a period within one month?

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

Which shall be valid for six months? Which shall be valid for six months? Period. And then the permit shall expire after six months, whichever comes first. Whichever comes first, subject to renewal. I don't think it is necessary for us to include renewable once per year since the validity is six months, so it is redundant to include once per year.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

For the justification, Mr. Chair, the...We intended to define, there are cases that we observed that during a certain kay daghan man basura, more than three times sila maka kuan, but during the period ra pud, so dili na sila mo kuan. So mao to na nagbutang lang pud mi, in case that, for example, during the Christmas season.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

That's why I suggested that we specify within a period of one month. Which shall be valid for six months.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

Six months. Yes.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

Okay, the permit shall expire after six months or whichever comes first or after disposal of more than three times. (Aha na tong original na proposal?)

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

The original proposal, Mr. Chair, is to define initially we...sa subsection sa baba. We have special permit for those non-, dili nila negosyo ang mag collect nang basura.

So kani sila, the regular disposal permit shall be issued to those entities that will be disposing as part of their, part siguro sa ilang nature of business nila, nga with kung moabot sila nang mo more than, mo dispose na gani sila nang more than three times within one month, regular permit na gyud dapat ilang kuhaon, dili na kadtong special.

HON. JOENIL B. ALDONZA/PRESIDING OFFICER:

Also, I have this letter M, Special Disposal Permit. Since this is special, how about the fee of this special disposal permit?

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/ CITY ENR OFFICER:

Come again, Mr. Chair.

HON. JOENIL B. ALDONZA/PRESIDING OFFICER:

The fee? Bayrunon.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

The Special Disposal Permit, naa tay fee to pay. Oo for them to pay for the registration process. So, every time they dispose, it is also a separate fee during the tipping, the measurement of the weight. So, we included the registration of this, para ma identify nato sin-o katong mga kanang nag renovate ra, maghatag ta nang special permit, nga maglabay sa kuan, so e- registered nato sila . So, kaning special disposal permit will be the registration nila pud to allowing them to dispose at the landfill.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

Section 3. Tipping fee. So the tipping fee should be ₱100.00 for every 100 kilograms of residual waste. If it's 101.0 ,200 na? So I suggest that the, rephrase it into the tipping fee should be ₱100.00 for every 100 kilograms or a fraction thereof. Meaning any additional weight, no matter how small, is charged as an additional ₱100.00 for each 100 kilo increment or part of it.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER: Actually, Mr. Chair, we also provided the matrix. So from 0 to 100 kilograms, that's 100. Between 0.2, ah 0.1 to 0.2 so regardless kung asa siya, between.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

200.00 na?

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

Oh 200 iya bayaran.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:

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506 So it should be, so it should be 0.1,1 or 0.1, oh di ba? Kay same ra baja sila 0.10, tapos 200
507 na and then 100 pa sa pikas di ba?

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509 **ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:**

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511 So we will include the third decimal.

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513 **HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR:**

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515 So that is why I proposed that "a fraction thereof would", di ba?

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552 My last proposal is Section 9. Exemptions and Special Considerations. Exemptions from the
553 tipping fee may be granted to entities or to situations as determined by Sangguniang Panlungsod
554 through a resolution.

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556 I propose to amend Section 9 , I propose that this will now be the new Section 9. Exemptions
557 from the Tipping Fee may be granted to individuals or entities upon determination by the Sangguniang
558 Panlungsod through the passage of an appropriate resolution. With no grounds na? Or what do you
559 think? With no specific grounds?

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561 **ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:**

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Yes, Mr. Chair. Actually, this section is added in case there are instances such as...

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR.:

Unforeseen events.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

The aftermath of a typhoon, where there is a need to conduct clean up, to conduct recovery.

HON. NOEL CHRISTIAN G. CATRE, JR.:

Exactly.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

Tipping fees shall be suspended through a resolution from the SP.

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Some clarification, Mr. Chairman please.

Section 3. There is no individual entities or institutions or commercial entities outside Surigao City are no longer allowed? To dispose...is this part of the ordinance?

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

This is added Mr. Chair, because last, during previous reading, Second Reading, the City ENRO was asked, how do we define outside entities and inside entities? We were, we conducted a review such that no individual outside Surigao City can directly dispose their waste at the sanitary landfill. So, the amendment or the revised ordinance is that the LGUs first should have a MOA. Then the individual...

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Yes. We understand that but is this part of the ordinance? Because if this is part of the ordinance, then the form is erroneous. It should not be no...or it should constitute another paragraph, or section.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

Noted, Mr. Chair. So, it shall be added as a clause for the...

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

It should also be...I would suggest that they should also be incorporated in the definition of terms. For example, regular disposal permit. A permit issued to entities registered in Surigao City.

ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:

Yes, Mr. Chair.

HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:

Special disposal permit shall also be issued to entities registered in Surigao City. May I suggest that as amendments.

619 **HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:**

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621 So, inin note, mahimo ini na separate provision?

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623 **ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:**

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625 Yes.

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629 Or, paragraph 3 of Section 3?

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631 **ENGR. JOSE ALFONSO A. CASURRA/CITY ENR OFFICER:**

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633 It could be added as a clause under Section 3, not a note.

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635 **HON. JOSE EXPEDITUS B. BAYANA:**

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637 Then Section 5.1.3...the Memorandum of Agreement to be entered into by the City Mayor and

638 after the endorsement of the City ENRO, the City Legal Officer must also have the authority of the SP?

639 Because this might be interpreted that the Mayor can just enter into a Memorandum of Agreement

640 without seeking the approval of the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

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652 Again, there is a note. So, this should again be another paragraph. Those are the only
653 suggested amendments, Mr. Chairman. Thank you.
