WHEREAS, Barangay Silop enacted Barangay Ordinance No. 01, Series of 2025;

WHEREAS, pursuant to **Section 59, paragraphs (a), (b), and (c)** of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the **Local Government Code of 1991**, barangay ordinances must be published or posted in a conspicuous place within the barangay for a period of at least three (3) consecutive weeks and comply with other procedural requirements to become effective;

WHEREAS, it appears that Barangay Silop has not yet complied with said publication/posting requirement;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Noel P. Catre, jointly seconded by Hon. Karl Duane A. Casurra and Hon. Baltazar C. Abian, it was unanimously;

RESOLVED: as it is hereby resolved, to **return Barangay Ordinance No. 01, Series of 2025 of Barangay Silop**, and request the Barangay Council to **comply with the publication/posting requirement** under Section 59 of the Local Government Code;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Office of the City Mayor, Barangay Council of Barangay Silop, and all office concerned for their information and compliance.

Committee on Rules

SUBJECT:

In the matter of the resolution of Barangay Ordinance No. 1 Series of 2025 of Barangay Rizal prohibiting heavy equipment such as trucks to use its barangay roads.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

The committee finds the proposed ordinance to be unreasonable or ultra vires since barangay roads are public property such that its use may not be prohibited. It may, however, be regulated such as use may be time restricted, tonnage may be limited or permitting systems for purposes of safety and preservation of infrastructure and public welfare.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the ordinance be returned for modification revision or amendment instead of an outright declaration of nullity.

RESOLUTION NO. 132 – 2025

A RESOLUTION RETURNING BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 1, SERIES OF 2025 OF BARANGAY RIZAL AND ADVISING THAT THE TOTAL PROHIBITION ON HEAVY TRUCKS MAY BE BEYOND BARANGAY AUTHORITY; REGULATION IS ENCOURAGED INSTEAD

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Rizal enacted Ordinance No. 1, Series of 2025, **prohibiting the use of heavy trucks on barangay roads;**

WHEREAS, **barangay roads are public property** and the unqualified prohibition of access to them may be considered **unreasonable or ultra vires;**

WHEREAS, while the barangay may not **completely prohibit access** to its roads, it **may regulate** the use of said roads by imposing **reasonable conditions**, such as **time restrictions, tonnage limits, or permitting systems**, for purposes of **safety, preservation of infrastructure, and public welfare;**

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Noel P. Catre, jointly seconded by Hon. Joenil B. Aldonza and Hon. Joshua Emilio S. Geli, it was unanimously;

RESOLVED: as it is hereby resolved, to **return Ordinance No. 1, Series of 2025 of Barangay Rizal** and **advise that instead of prohibiting**, the barangay may consider **regulating the use of barangay roads by heavy trucks**, in accordance with applicable laws and in consultation with relevant city or municipal authorities;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Office of the City Mayor, Barangay Council of Barangay Rizal, and all office concerned for their information and compliance.

SUBJECT:

In the matter of the request of the City of San Juan, Metro Manila for sisterhood relationship.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

The committee finds that there is legal and factual basis for the proposed relationship. In fact, there had been instances when Surigao City entered into sisterhood relationship with the City of Pasig during the incumbency of the Honorable Vice Mayor as City Mayor of Surigao.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is, therefore, recommended that we join the City of Surigao join the request of San Juan City to establish sisterhood relationship.

RESOLUTION NO. 133 – 2025

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND JOINING THE REQUEST OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF SAN JUAN, METRO MANILA FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SISTERHOOD RELATIONS WITH THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF SURIGAO, FOR PURPOSES OF STRENGTHENING MUTUAL COOPERATION, CULTURAL EXCHANGE, AND DEVELOPMENTAL PARTNERSHIP

WHEREAS, the City Government of San Juan, Metro Manila has expressed its intent to establish sisterhood relations with the City Government of Surigao, aimed at fostering mutual goodwill, cultural exchange, economic collaboration, tourism promotion, and shared learning in governance and development;

WHEREAS, Section 3(f) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, encourages local government units to develop partnerships and cooperative undertakings to improve public service and promote the welfare of their constituents;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Surigao recognizes the value of forging sisterhood ties with equally progressive local government units, such as San Juan City, to create platforms for technical cooperation, inter-city collaboration, and people-to-people engagements;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Surigao City fully supports the establishment of sisterhood relations with the City Government of San Juan and affirms its commitment to work toward the realization of this partnership;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Noel P. Catre, duly seconded by all the Members of the Sangguniang Panlungsod present, it was unanimously;

RESOLVED: as it is hereby resolved, by the **Sangguniang Panlungsod of Surigao City**, in session duly assembled, to **approve and join the request of the City Government of San Juan, Metro Manila for the establishment of sisterhood relations with the City Government of Surigao**;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the City Mayor be authorized to negotiate, sign, and enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) formalizing the sisterhood relationship, subject to the existing laws, rules, and regulations;

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Office of the City Mayor, City Government of San Juan, Metro Manila, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), and other concerned offices for their information and appropriate action.

SUBJECT:

In the matter of DILG Memorandum Circular 2025-060 Amended Guidelines on the Accreditation of Civil Society Organizations and Selection of Representatives to the Local Special Bodies.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

This is a matter for Local Government Units to follow and observe so that accreditation and selection of representatives to the local special bodies will be expedited and pursuant to the memorandum circular.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is therefore recommended that this body adopts the said memorandum circular including the form and substance of the documents to be submitted by applicants for accreditation. Furthermore, it is recommended that the matter be publicized so that the applicants for accreditation will be guided accordingly.

RESOLUTION NO. 134 – 2025

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE GUIDELINES SET FORTH IN
MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2025-060 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE
INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DILG) ON THE ACCREDITATION OF
LOCAL SPECIAL BODIES, AND DIRECTING THE SECRETARY TO CAUSE THE
POSTING THEREOF**

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) issued Memorandum Circular No. 2025-060, prescribing guidelines for the accreditation of local special bodies, such as the Local Development Council, Local Health Board, Local School Board, and Peace and Order Council;

WHEREAS, said circular promotes transparency, inclusiveness, and accountability in local governance, particularly in the participation of civil society organizations (CSOs) and other stakeholders in policy formulation and development planning;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Surigao City deems it necessary to adopt these guidelines and disseminate them for the information and guidance of all concerned sectors and barangays;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Noel P. Catre, duly seconded by Hon. Perfecto B. Consigo it was unanimously

RESOLVED: as it is hereby resolved, to **adopt and implement the guidelines** set forth in **DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2025-060** on the accreditation of members of local special bodies;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod is hereby **directed to reproduce copies of said circular and cause its posting in conspicuous places** within the City Hall and other appropriate public areas.

Furthermore, the **Honorable Noel P. Catre** raised a query concerning the status or the inventory of Local Civil Society Organizations (CSOs).

HON. NOEL P. CATRE:

I have no further committee report but may I add, Your Honor, that yesterday, I heard, no, no, the other day there was a meeting here involving the adoption of the Memorandum Circular for purposes of adopting it to guide the Sangguniang Panlungsod in the matter of accrediting Local Civil Society Groups. I understand that an inventory of the Civil Society Groups have been made? Is that true? Madame Secretary?

MS. EDNA B. SIEGA / SP SECRETARY:

I think, Hon. Catre, the CPDO they have their inventory regarding the CSOs.

HON. NOEL P. CATRE:

I heard it over the radio that there was an inventory of the Civil Society. If there is such an inventory, may I request the City Sanggunian to obtain a copy so that the members of the Council can be guided accordingly when an application for accreditation will be submitted to this body. Thank you.

MS. EDNA B. SIEGA / SP SECRETARY:

Noted, Hon. Catre.

The **Honorable Perfecto B. Consigo** was recognized for the presentation of his committee report.

HON. PERFECTO B. CONSIGO:

Good afternoon, Mr. Chair, my colleagues, visitors, good afternoon to all.

COMMITTEE REPORT COMMITTEE ON GENERAL SERVICES AND PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

SUBJECT:

Consultation with committee member and city officials concerned on matters of Government Services and Property Management

FACTS/FINDINGS:

A committee consultation was conducted on July 21, 2025 at 9:00 am at the office the Committee Chairman with the attendance Hon. Karl Duane Casurra, City Councilor; Engr. Jose Alfonso Casurra, City ENRO; Atty. Jeffrey Galido, City Budget Officer; Engr. Dionisio Boquid Jr, OIC-CGSO; Sandie A. Cagata. EMS-II; The subject of discussion was on the following issues: 1. Purchase of 12 garbage trucks 2. Purchase of vulcanizing machine 3. Purchase of car wash machine. 4. Increase garbage collectors and street sweepers from P250.00 to P300.00 per day. 5. To construct BODEGA to be used solely for General Services Office. After a thorough deliberation, the committee members agreed for the purchase of the items mentioned, but subject to the approval of the City Mayor. According to the Budget Officer, Atty. Galido, the amount can be charged to LDR (Disaster). The increase of P50.00 per day will be charge as hazard fee in lieu of salary increased.

RECOMMENDATION:

The following subject proposal be referred by this body to the Hon. City Mayor for his approval.

That is all, Mr. Chair. I so move, Mr. Chair.

The motion to adopt the committee report was approved. Thereafter, a motion was presented by the proponent.

HON. PERFECTO B. CONSIGO:

Mr. Chair, as it was adopted already, I therefore move for the approval of authorizing the City Mayor to purchase the following items:

- Purchase of 12 garbage trucks
- Purchase of vulcanizing machines
- Purchase of car wash machines
- To construct BODEGA to be used solely for General Services Office
- Increase garbage collectors and street sweepers from P250.00 to P300.00 per day.

I so move, Mr. Chair.

After the motion of the proponent, there was a clarification and discussion on the matter.

The **Honorable Baltazar C. Abian** sought clarification on whether the proposed increase referred to a **salary adjustment** or a **hazard fee**. The **proponent clarified** that the increase pertains **solely to a hazard fee**, not a salary increase.

Another, points raised by **Honorable Noel P. Catre**, he clarified that the motion pertains to a **purchase**, not a salary increase. He requested specific details regarding the brand and specifications of the garbage trucks, how much the estimated cost per unit, the total number of units to be purchased, the availability of funds, including a certification from the Budget Officer confirming funding for 12 units.

The **Hon. Perfecto B. Consigo** responded and confirmed that a committee hearing on the matter had already been conducted. He also explained that the specific details of the garbage trucks, as to the brand and price, were not yet available, as the approval would precede the canvassing process.

And **Honorable Abian**, suggested conducting another round of committee hearings to clarify the type of dump trucks, determine the total cost and assess budget capacity, revisit the proposed increase for sanitation workers, ensuring it aligns with available funds.

The Presiding Officer **Honorable Arnold A. Go**, acknowledged and noted the suggestions of Hon. Abian and Hon. Catre, and he directed Hon. Consigo to consider conducting another committee meeting. The **Hon. Perfecto B. Consigo**, explained that the resolution under consideration is to authorize the canvassing process, not the final purchase. He emphasized that canvassing can only proceed after approval of the resolution and he confirmed the intent to coordinate with the City Treasurer regarding fund availability for the proposed salary increase.

The **Honorable Noel P. Catre**, moved for the amendment to the original motion. He moved to authorize the concerned agency to make a canvass of the vehicles to be purchased. But upon further discussion, he withdrew the motion, so that the matter can be sent back to the committee for further hearing.

The **Honorable Perfecto B. Consigo** was amenable to conduct another round of committee hearing in response to the concerns raised by fellow members of the **Sangguniang Panlungsod**.

The **Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo** was recognized for his committee report.

HON. FLORENILLO B. RAVELO:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Good afternoon, everyone.

COMMITTEE REPORT

COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION, COMMUNICATION AND UTILITIES

SUBJECT:

An Endorsement from Tricycle and Trisikad Franchising Office, Endorsing 111 applicants for tricycle franchise.

FACTS/FINDINGS:

- The 111 applicants for tricycle franchise were classified as follows:*
 - o 88 – Extension of MTOP (motorized tricycle operators permit) Validity*
 - o 05 – Extension of MTOP validity and substitution of unit*
 - o 16 – Substitution of unit*
 - o 01 – Extension of MTOP Validity & Transfer of Franchise*
 - o 01 – Amendment of Franchise*

RECOMMENDATION:

The 111 applicants for Tricycle Franchise which are classified as 88 for Extension of MTOP Validity, 05 for Extension of MTOP Validity and Substitution of unit, 16 for Substitution of unit, 01 extension of MTOP Validity & Transfer of Franchise and 01 Amendment of Franchise, their application were found to be in order and have complied the required documents.

So, I move for the adoption of my committee report.

The motion to adopt the committee report was approved. Before the approval, the **Honorable Noel P. Catre** was recognized for some queries regarding the Substitution of Tricycle Units. He asks whether substitution requires a brand-new unit and Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo confirmed it.

Hon. Catre also inquires if a physical inventory of units to be substituted has been conducted. The proponent confirms that the Tricycle and Franchising Office handled the inventory.

The **Honorable Noel P. Catre** wants to **suspend the rules** to ask further questions, likely for clarification or accountability. And **Honorable Joshua Emilio S. Geli** suggests calling the City Transportation Committee or Franchise Office for a representative and proposes a 5–10 minute recess, and **Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra** formally moves for a recess.

RECESS

The session **RESUMED**, and the **Honorable Joshua Emilio S. Geli** moved for the **SUSPENSION OF THE RULES** to accommodate the representative of the Tricycle Trisikad Franchising Office, Atty. Lex Joshua Silvosa, and **RULES WERE SUSPENDED**.

HON. ARNOLD A. GO/ PRESIDING OFFICER:

Good afternoon, Atty. Lex Silvosa. We have some concerns with regard to the franchise, Tricycle franchise for the 111 applicants. I believe the Honorable Noel P. Catre....

HON. NOEL P. CATRE:

Yes, Mr. Chair. I was asking about the substitution. What is this substitution about? Is this substitution of ownership, substitution of the body, substitution of the motorcycle, or what?

ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:

Okay, good afternoon, Mr. Chairman. Good afternoon to the members of this august body. For the endorsement for substitution, as we can see, there is extension of MTOP, which refers to the renewal of the franchise, and substitution of unit. There are also 16 substitutions of units. Mr. Chairman, this refers to the change of the motorcycle itself. Some of our motorcycles and our

644 franchises have dilapidated or, shall we say, old motorcycle units. That is why they apply for the
 645 change of the motorcycle itself. We refer it as substitution of unit because this is how it is referred in
 646 the ordinance itself.

647

648 **HON. ARNOLD A. GO/ PRESIDING OFFICER:**

649

650 *But, excuse me, but with the same owner?*

651

652 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

653

654 *With the same owner, Mr. Chairman. As for the change of ownership, this is a separate*
 655 *application also.*

656

657 **HON. ARNOLD A. GO/ PRESIDING OFFICER:**

658

659 *Okay.*

660

661 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

662

663 *Yes, Mr. Chairman.*

664

665 **HON. ARNOLD A. GO/ PRESIDING OFFICER:**

666

667 *Honorable Catre.*

668

669 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

670

671 *So, there is a separate application for substitution of ownership?*

672

673 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

674

675 *Yes, Mr. Chairman.*

676

677 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

678

679 *And in this request, substitution of ownership is not one of those requested?*

680

681 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

682

683 *No, Mr. Chairman. It will be, it refers only to the substitution of the unit itself. It refers to the*
 684 *motorcycle itself, including the OR and the CR are registered to the franchise. With this, it comes also*
 685 *with the dropping. Mr. Chairman, this means that the old unit is dropped so, that the new unit will be*
 686 *used in the franchise. And will be stated in the franchise itself.*

687

688 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

689

690 *So, the new unit is inspected by those in charge?*

691

692 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

693

694 *Yes, Mr. Chairman. Before we approve, as you can see in the application form, it also comes*
 695 *with a certificate of roadworthiness, Mr. Chairman. This means that before we endorse this*
 696 *substitution, it has passed through rigid inspection from the office of the Tricycle Franchise Office, Mr.*
 697 *Chairman. So, this has gone through inspection.*

698

699 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

700

701 *And who supervises the Franchise Office?*

702

703 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

704

705 *Yes, based on the amendment, Mr. Chairman, this has been moved to the Office of the City*
 706 *Mayor. And, as of the moment, the City Mayor has delegated this representation as the OIC of the*
 707 *Tricycle Franchise Office, Mr. Chairman.*

708

709 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

710

711 *And in your capacity as the OIC, you have seen the brand new unit that are intended to be*
 712 *the substitutes?*

713

714 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

715

716 *We have three bodies who will conduct the inspection before we formally issue the certificate*
 717 *of roadworthiness. We have a representative from my office who I delegated as the inspector. We*
 718 *have also a representative from the City ENRO Office as their inspector. And one also from the City*
 719 *Traffic Office as a inspector. So, there are three bodies who comprises this, Mr. Chairman. They will*
 720 *sign on the certificate of roadworthiness before I approve the same, Mr. Chairman.*

721

722 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

723

724 *And so, they have complied with this requirement of providing your Office with the certificate*
 725 *of roadworthiness, you find them to be in order?*

726

727 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

728

729 *Yes, Mr. Chairman. Because as we inspect, we only not inspect the motorcycle itself, but also*
 730 *the body of the tricycle. Including the signals, the headlights, the taillights, and the body itself must be*
 731 *roadworthy and functional, Mr. Chairman.*

732

733 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

734

735 *How about the number? The body number?*

736

737 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

738

739 *Yes, Mr. Chairman. Together with this, we also have photos that there must be a body number*
 740 *indicated in both sides, at the backside and in front, together with the motorcycle plate.*

741

742 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

743

744 *Okay. As a side question, how many tricycles do we have at present?*

745

746 **ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:**

747

748 *At present, we have 3,500 franchises of Tricycles, Mr. Chairman.*

749

750 **HON. NOEL P. CATRE:**

751

752 *So, is your Office still entertaining application for issuance of new franchises?*

753

ATTY. LEX JOSHUA ANDREW U. SILVOSA/CITY ADMINISTRATOR:

As of the moment, Mr. Chairman, since we have already reached the maximum franchises as indicated by our ordinances, which is 3,500, therefore we are not entertaining any application for new franchises, and we are not submitting new franchises itself to this honorable body.

HON. NOEL P. CATRE:

So, with the assurance, Your Honor, of the City Administrator, that the substitution involves substitution of the unit, not of ownership, then I am satisfied. Thank you.

Then the **Honorable Baltazar C. Abian** was recognized. He raised concerns about the many colorum units that **are old tricycles** whose owners failed to renew due to financial constraints. Then, he asked if there's a plan to assist these operators.

Atty. Silvosa clarified that, under existing ordinances and national law, *colorum* refers to tricycles operating without valid franchises. He emphasized that the city has already reached the maximum franchise of 3,500 units as stipulated in the ordinance. As a result, the Franchise Office is not accepting new applications. No new franchises can be issued unless within the existing cap. The city is strictly adhering to the ordinance and cannot accommodate additional units beyond the limit.

After the lengthy discussion and clarifications, the **RULES WERE REINSTATED** and Atty. Lex Joshua U. Silvosa was excused.

Thereafter, a motion was presented and approved, to wit:

RESOLUTION NO. 135 - 2025

WHEREAS, the TTFO Committee favorably acted on the endorsement from the Tricycle Trisikad Franchising Office concerning One Hundred Eleven (111) applications for Tricycle-for-Hire Franchises. These applications are classified as follows: Eighty-eight (88) Extension of MTOP Validity, Five (5) Extension of MTOP Validity & Substitution of Unit, Sixteen (16) Substitution of Unit, One (1) Extension of MTOP Validity and Transfer of Franchise and One (1) Asmendment of Name. All applications were submitted with complete supporting documents and the corresponding Certificates of Road Worthiness.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Florenillo B. Ravelo, duly seconded by Honorable Perfecto B. Consigo, it was unanimously;

MS. EDNA B. SIEGA/SP SECRETARY:

We have one, other matters. We have another visitor from Nonoc Elementary School asking assistance from this August body regarding their problem, a request for immediate action of their classroom problem. We have here Sir Rey G. Quiño School Head of Nonoc National High School, and Ma'am Arlyn P. Osorio, School Head of Nonoc Elementary School.

The **Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra** moved for the **SUSPENSION OF THE RULES** in order to accommodate the guests present during the session and **RULES WERE SUSPENDED**. The School Heads of Nonoc National High School was recognized.

MR. REY G. QUIÑO/SCHOOL HEAD, NONOC NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL:

Good afternoon, everyone. My name is Rey G. Quinio, the School Head of Nonoc National High School. So, as the School Head of Nonoc National High School, it is my urgent concern at this moment, upon seeing the picture, that is the real scenario of the school. So, considering also that the Panahon kuman nan Habagat, so the School is very prone, very much prone sa tidal waves or rather storm surges at the same time brought by Habagat or the southwest monsoon. So, I have already done my part, asking assistance from our Barangay Council together with the mining company, the PNPI, but they could not assure the school to have such a seawall or kanang lig-on gyud nga na seawall to protect the school itself. So, I am humbly appealing in your, or this honorable body, to humbly ask urgent or immediate action for a kind of help for the school. Thank you so much.

Honorable Karl Duane A. Casurra reported recent information regarding the damaged seawall at Nonoc National High School. He recommended that the matter be referred to the City Engineering Office and the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CDRRMC) for evaluation and assessment.

Mr. Rey G. Quiño, School Head of Nonoc National High School, confirmed that the GPTA had submitted a resolution to the Barangay Council requesting assistance. However, no concrete action has been taken yet.

Honorable Noel P. Catre emphasized the financial magnitude of constructing a seawall, estimating it would require millions of pesos. He suggested that the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), through the congressional allotment, would be the most viable source of funding.

Honorable Catre also recommended that the PTA and school authorities pass a resolution directly to the DPWH. Additionally, the Barangay Council should pass a resolution to strengthen the request, which could then be supported by a resolution from the Sangguniang Panlungsod.

Honorable Joenil B. Aldonza also inquired about the elementary student population in Nonoc. **Ms. Arlyn P. Osorio**, School Head of Nonoc Elementary School, reported they have a total of 153 students.

The Presiding Officer, emphasizes the procedural requirement for initiating action at the city council level: Before the **Sangguniang Panlungsod** (City Council) can pass a resolution regarding the concerned party must first secure a resolution from the Barangay Council. The Barangay Council must endorse or approve the request through a formal resolution. Once that's done, the **City Council** can then deliberate and pass its own resolution to accommodate or act on the matter.

The **Honorable Joshua Emilio** moved for the **REINSTATEMENT OF THE RULES AND RULES WERE REINSTATED**.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no matters discussed, the 26th Regular Session was adjourned at 3:08 o'clock in the afternoon of July 24, 2025.
